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In the Name of God Amen, I George Eubanks of the County of Person & State of North Carolina, being Saphim in body but of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will & Testament in manner & form following, that is to say, I will that all my Just Debts be ~~lawfully~~ paid & discharged by my Executors & Executrices hereafter named, I then I do give to my beloved Wife Betty Eubanks, whom I appoint one of my Executors, three hundred & seventy three acres of Land, lying in the County of Person, & seventy & a half acres of Land, lying in the County of Orange, together with six Negroes named as follows, Jack, Hannah, Sarah, David, Jerry & Susannah, with all household and kitchen furniture, together with all my Plantation utensils & stock of all kind that I now possess, during her widowhood & at the end of her widowhood I do give to my son Thomas Eubanks whom I appoint another Executor of this my last will & Testament, two hundred & twenty one ~~and~~ three quarters of Land off the west side of my tract, together with the Improvements thereunto belonging, also I do give and bequeath unto my son George Eubanks, two hundred & twenty one acres & three quarters of Land off the East Side of my tract, but if of Either of my sons Thomas or George Eubanks, dies without heirs lawfully begotten of their body then their part of my Land shall fall to the surviving Brother & his heirs forever, I then I do give my Daughter Frances Mott, one of the County of King & Queen, in the State of Virginia, one Negro boy named Charles, also I do give & devise unto my Daughter Mary Carlton, also of the said County of King & Queen, one Negro Girl named Rachel, also I do give by bequeath unto my Daughter Catherine Eubanks one Negro Girl named Phoebe, I also do give & bequeath unto my son

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Thomas Eubanks one Negro boy named Spencer & one feather bed & furniture also I do lend to my Daughter Betty Eubanks during her natural life one Negro Girl named Henry and then at her death I give & bequeath unto the heirs of her body lawfully begotten by James Eubanks, the said Henry & her increase to be equally divided among them, I then I do give & bequeath unto my son George Eubanks one Negro Girl named Ann together with forty two pounds & ten shillings Virginia money, now in the hands of George Melore, I then I do give and devise that at the Expiration of my wife's widowhood that the six negroes with their increase, (to wit) Jack, Hannah, Sarah, David, Jerry, & Susannah, be lotted out and by appraisement be equally divided among my two sons & four daughters, also it is my will that at the end of my wife's widowhood that all my household furniture and Plantation tools, together with my stock of all kinds be sold & equally divided amongst my six children (to wit) Frances Mott, Mary Carlton, Catherine Eubanks, Thomas Eubanks, Betty Eubanks, & George Eubanks, lastly having before appointed my wife Betty Eubanks, & my son Thomas Eubanks, & my son in law John Eubanks, Executors of this my last will & Testament — In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this the 15th of July in the year of our Lord 1798
