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In the Name of God Amen, I George Eubanks of the County of Person & State of North Carolina being Taverner in ~~1796~~
Butt of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and
rein my last will & Testament in manner & form
following, that is to say, I will that all my just debts be
paid & discharged by my Executors & Executrix
hereafter named, Item, I do leave to my beloved wife Betty
Eubanks, whom I appoint one of my Executrix, Three hundred
& twenty five acres of Land, lying in the County of Person, &
Sixty & six half acres of Land, lying in the County of Orange.
Together with six Negroes named as follows, Jack, Sarah
Sarah, Anne, Jerry & Isabell, with all household and
kitchen furniture, together with all my Plantation utensils
& Stock of all kinds that I now possess, during her widowhood
& at the end of her widowhood I do give to my son Thomas
Eubanks whom I appoint another Executor of this my
last will & Testament, two hundred & twenty one ~~one~~ three quarters
of land off the west side of my tract, together with the Improvements
thereunto belonging, also I do give and bequeath unto my son George
Eubanks, two hundred & twenty one acres & three quarters of land off
the East side of my tract, but & if either of my sons Thomas or
George Eubanks dies without heirs lawfully begotten of their body
then their part of my land shall fall to the surviving brother &
his heirs & friends, Item, I do give my Daughter Francis
Wyatt, now of the County of King & Queen, in the state of
Virginia, one Negro boy named Charles, also I do give & demise
unto my Daughter Mary Carlton now of the said County of
King & Queen, one Negro Girl named Rachel, also I do give &
bequeath unto my Daughter Catherine Eubanks one Negro girl
named Sherry, I also do give & bequeath unto my son

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Thomas Eubanks one Negro boy named Spencer & one feather bed
& furniture also I do leave to my Daughter Betty Eubanks during
her natural life one Negro girl named Henry and then at her death
I give & bequeath unto the heirs of her body lawfully begotten by
James Eubanks, the said Henry & her increase to be equally
divided among them, Item I do give & bequeath unto my son
George Eubanks one Negro girl named Ann together with forty
two pounds ten shillings Virginia money, now in the hands of
George Malone, Item, this my will & desire that at the
Expiration of my wife's widowhood that the six negroes
with their increase, (to wit) Jack, Sarah, Anne, David, Jerry &
Isabell, be sold out and by Agreement to be equally divided
among my two sons & four daughters, also it is my will that
at the end of my wife's widowhood that all my household furniture
and Plantation tools, together with my stock of all kinds be sold
& equally divided amongst my six children, to wit, Francis
Wyatt, Mary Carlton, Catherine Eubanks, Thomas Eubanks,
Betty Eubanks, & George Eubanks, lastly having before
appointed my wife Betty Eubanks & my son Thomas Eubanks,
& my son unless John Eubanks, Executrix of this my last will
& Testament. In Witness whereof I have counterset my
hand and seal, this the 15th of July in the year of our
Lord 1798.

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This Indenture made this 1st day of Decemr. in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & Ninety eight Between Thomas W. Burton Esq; in behalf of the Justices of the County of Person & their Successors in Office of the one Part and Jacob Fuller of the other Part witnesseth that the said Thomas W. Burton agreeable to an order of the said County Court made the day and year above written doth place and bind unto the said Jacob Fuller; Walter Fuller an orphan of the age of 16 Years, to live after the manner of an apprentice & servant until he shall attain to the age of 21 years during all which time his said Master faithfully shall serve, his lawfull commands every where gladly obey, he shall not at any time absent himself from his said Masters service without leave but in all things as a good & faithfull servant shall behave towards his said Master & the said Jacob Fuller doth Covenant Promise & agree to & with the said Thomas W. Burton that he will teach & instruct or cause to be taught & instructed the said Walter Fuller according to law to read write &c also the art & mystery of a Planter, & that he will constantly find & provide for the said apprentice, during the term aforesaid, sufficient diet washing lodging & apparel fitting, for an apprentice & servant, & also all other things necessary both in sickness & in health,
