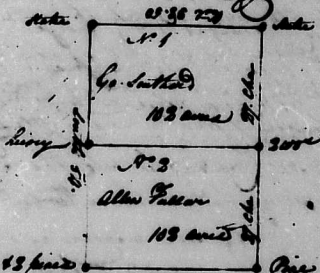


September Court 1795

State of North Carolina

Prisoners

In Pursuant to an Order of our County Court of Prison to an Prisoner for the Purpose of Equally Dividing the Lands of the late George Rowbrook Esq. agreeable to his last will and Testament between his two Executors George Leather & Allen Fuller. We have accordingly by and on the Prisoner & Divided it in the following Manner & from this



George Leather No. 1, on the North Beginning at a stake a line of Twenty Rods due West & South then due East thirty Eight Chain & fifty links to two White Oaks in a small wood in South field due West due North twenty Seven Chain to a stake on end & back due West thirty Eight Chain & fifty links to the beginning containing one hundred & two acres. Allen Fuller No. 2, on the South End of the land Beginning at a small spring on End of Lewis: a corner of George Leather's land, thence with his line East thirty Eight Chain & fifty links to two White Oaks on South field due West due North twenty Seven Chain to a stake a corner of Thomas' land thence due West thirty Eight Chain & fifty links to a White Oak & two small pieces a corner of Edmund Lewis' thence due West to the beginning containing one hundred & two acres.

George Leather's Last Will & Testament to Lth Allen Fuller & No. 2. On to 600 Lth 1000

It is therefore on the 1st of that the said Allen Fuller pay unto the said George Leather the Last sum of Ten pounds. Court being when ever the same may appear to be due under the Act of assembly in that Case made & provided. We have also agreeable to the Order of said Court to go Directed & Directed to Divide the Personal Estate of said George Rowbrook Esq. between his two Executors to Mr. George Leather & Allen Fuller, & as the personal Estate appears to be to the amount of Ninety pounds & four pence in Hand &c. with from the 8th of October 1795. Therefore we do appoint & appoint that the same be Equally Divided between the said George Leather & Allen Fuller & paid unto them or their proper Representatives at such a time & in such manner as the Law requires in that Case made & provided & in and on the 16th day of July 1795
