

March Term 1802

In the name of God Amen. I Giles Trichey of this County and State of South Carolina being sick and Weak of body but of perfect mind and memory do bequeath my body to the Grace and my soul to God who gave it. And as for such worldly Goods as it has pleased God to bestow on me I do dispose of the same in manner and form following Viz. I First Order that all my Just debts be paid from my and bequeath unto my well beloved son William Trichey one hundred Acres of land to be laid off by a North & South line on the West side, also one man and one horse. Then I give and bequeath unto my son John Trichey one hundred and twenty acres of land including the Mill below off by a North & South line on the East side, also all my stock of Hogs Sheep cattle & horses except the Cow and the Sorell man that has a young foal that I have given as above to William Trichey, and all my house hold furniture and also my books of all kinds. Then I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Anne the sum of twenty Shilling in Money and one Gilt Tank. Then I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Duell the sum of ten pounds to be paid her in money. Lastly I do ordain constitute and appoint my sons William & John Trichey to be my whole and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament discharging and making void all former wills and Testaments, and that the aforementioned Executors do fulfill all and every debt due or demand or in any wise appertaining Forward

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To me, and out of the Monies arising from the same pay and satisfy the four mentioned Legacies and any other Just debts and the overplus of any to be given to the said John Trichey & his wife. Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Ninth day of June one Thousand Seven hundred and Ninety five Signed sealed and acknowledged in the presence of us
