and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory
doe nominate my body to the grave and my soul to God
who Gave it. And as for such worldly Goods as it
has pleased God to bestow on me I do dispose of the
same in manner and form following viz a —
First I order that all my First debts be paid them
I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son William
Trickey one hundred acres of land to be laid off
by a North & South line on the West side, also one
man and one cow & them I give and bequeath
unto my son John Trickey one hundred and twenty acres
of Land including the Mill below off by a North &
South line on the East side, also all my first
of Hogs Sheep cattle & horses except the Cow and
the Sow that has a young boar that I
have given as above to William Trickey and all my
house hold furniture and also my books of all kinds
I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Anna
the sum of twenty Shillings in Money and one gilt
Trunk & them I give and bequeath unto my Daughter
Elizabeth Dwell the sum of ten pounds to be paid
her in money. Lastly I do ordain constitute and
appoint my son William & John Trickey to be my
whole and sole Executrix of this my last will
and testament disposing and making void
all former wills and testaments, and that the
aforementioned Executrix do collect all and every
debt due or demand'd or in any wise affininating
towards

To me, arise out of the Monies arising from the
same pay and satisfy the four mentioned Legacies
and any other First debts and the overplus if
any to be given to the said John Trickey &
S. with his. Wherof I have hereunto set my
hand and Seal this ninth day of June one
Thousand Seven hundred and Ninety nine
