This Indenture made this 7th day of June in the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight between Stephen Moore Esq^r on behalf of the Justices of the County of Person & their Associates in Office of the one Part and Moses Springfield of the other Part Witnesseth that the said Stephen Moore agreeable to an Order of the said County Court made the day and date above written doth place and bind unto the said Moses Springfield Matthew Jones an Orphan of the age of Eight years last Past to live after the manner of an Apprentice & Servant until he shall attain to the age of twenty one years during all which time his said Master lawfully shall serve his Lawfull Commands every where & lastly that he shall not at any time abscond himself from his said Masters Service without leave but in all things be good and Faithfull servant shall behave towards his said Master & the said Moses Springfield with Courtesy Promise & regard to & with the said Stephen Moore that he will teach & instruct for Cause to be taught & instructed the said Matthew Jones according to Law to read Write &c. also the art & Mystery of a Planter & that he will constantly feed & provide for the said apprentice during the term aforesaid sufficient washing Lining dirt & apparel fitting for an apprentice & servant and also all other things necessary both in sickness and in health in Witness whereof the Parties have Interchangeably set their hands & affixed their Seals the day & date above written Signed Sealed & Delivered in the Presence of

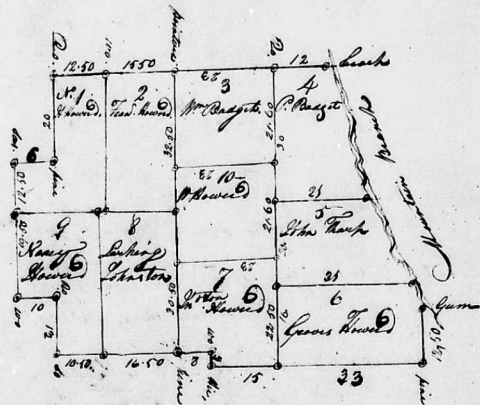
