shall behave towards his Master & the Pharmas Anne Moore with Consent
& agree to and with the the Shadrach Hargis that he will
Teach and Instructor Cause to be taught & Instructed the said Isaac
Brewer to learn to Read & write, to the end that a blanket and
that he will comfortably feed & provide for said apprentice
During the term of his sufficient food clothing, lodging and
other things in and apprentice and also all other things
necessary to both in sickness & in health.
