Consideration of the sum of Twelve pounds Eight  
Shillings & Nine pence Current money of Virginia  
to me in hand paid by Wm. Duty of the County  
& State aforesaid, the receipt whereof I do hereby  
acknowledge, have Bargained sold & Delivered  
unto the said Wm. Duty all my Part of the Crop now  
growing at the said Duties of Corn Tobacco &c  
and do hereby warrant & Differ the right of the  
same, unto the said William Duty the heirs & assigns  
from the Just claim or demand of any Person or  
Persons whatever; & his wife whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand & seal this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of  
September 1799 —

The condition of the above Bill of Sale is such  
that if the said John Bateman do & shall well &  
truly Pay or cause to be paid unto the said William  
Duty his heirs or assigns the above sum of Twelve  
pounds Eight Shillings & Nine pence Virginia currency  
with Lawfull Interest from the date hereof on or  
before the 25<sup>th</sup> day of December ensuing, then the above  
Bill of Sale to be void; or else to remain in full force  
& Virtue, the day & date above written, Witness my hand

In the name of God Amen, the nineteenth of April, one  
thousand seven hundred & Ninety nine, I James Pulliam  
of Person County & State of North Carolina, being sick & weak  
of body, but of sound & perfect Memory, do make Constitute  
& Ordain this to be my last will & Testament looking  
on other Will or Wills hitherto made or Ordained by me  
Declaring this & no other to be my last Will & Testament  
in manner & form following (179)

First, I give & bequeath my soul to almighty God  
who gave it & my body to the ground from whence it  
was taken, to be buried in a Christian like manner  
at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named —  
Item, First my Will & desire is that all my Just and  
lawfull debts be paid & my Funeral Expences discharged  
Next to what worldly Estate it hath pleased Almighty God  
to Bless me with, I give & bequeath in manner & form  
following

Item, I leave to my wife beloved wife Elizabeth Pulliam, During  
her Natural life or Widewhood all my Estate both  
Real & Personal of every kind whatsoever & after  
her Death my will & desire is that all my Personal  
Estate of every kind whatsoever be sold to the highest bidder  
at Twelve months Credit & the money arising from the  
Sale thereof to be Equally Divided between my Son and  
Daughters or their surviving heirs or Assigns —  
I do hereby constitute & Appoint my well beloved wife  
Elizabeth Pulliam Executrix & James Cochran & William  
Sugart Executors to this my last Will & Testament, as my  
trust & Repose is in them — Hoping they will see the same  
duly Executed. In witness whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand & affix my seal, the day & year above  
written —
