In the Name of God Amen. I Charles Taylor of the County of Parr
and State of North Carolina being weak in body, but of sound mind
& Memory. Whose be God! do this 11th day of March in the year
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety seven, make
& Publish this my last Will & Testament

I hereby Give unto my beloved wife the use & Benefice of my
Estate both Real & Personal for and during her Natural life
for the use & purposes of maintaining herself & my two Children
& Educating them; under the following Restrictions to wit
that no part of the unenclosed Ground which I bought of
William Green shall be cut down or cleared, or the same be
in any way sold, destroyed, & after the death of my said Wife,
I Give & bequeath the whole of my Estate, advanced both
Real & Personal unto my said two Daughters Easter
Southers & Elizabeth Ledy to them & their heirs forever
to be Equally Divided between them share & share alike -

Lastly I do nominate I appoint my dear friend Robert Dickins & my
Dear friend John Patton & Robert Executors of this my last
Will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
Hand & Seal this 11th day of March above written
