This 10th instant made the fifth day of June in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred & four Bataurus Paul Douglass
Chairman of the Board of Pearson County, State of North Carolina & I the
Judge of the said County doth then & there cause of the one that
I this day of the same part of this month had the undersigned Douglass
in pursuance to an Order of said County Court made the fifth day of
June as a writing to the direction of the Act of Assembly in this case made
and provided that place where unto the said John Long as a witness
named Benjamin Harris now of the age of Nineteen years old of
the County last with the said John Long being of the number of an
Apprentice & servant unto the said apprentice shall return to the
age of Twenty one years among all which time he said apprentice
shall faithfully & well serve his master commands every where
in the City of Raleigh and at any time absent himself from his said
Master or master without leave had in all things good goods and
faithfully serve him where to whom he will Masters and the said
John Long with consent previous & agree to & with the undersigned Douglass
that he will teach one instrument or course to be taught & instructed
the said Benjamin Harris the art & mystery of a Blacksmith
also to read & write & that he will constantly have & provide for each
of them during the term above and sufficient art working tools
& apparel fitting for an apprentice & along with other things necessary
with a subsistence & a bed etc.
