This Indenture made the fifth day of March
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & 5 between Samuel Smith
Chairman of the County Court of Person County & John Penick on
behalf of the Justice of the said County & their Successors of the one
part & Pulliam Williamson of the Other part witnesseth that the said Samuel
Smith in pursuance to an Order of the said County Court made the
6th day of March 1805 & according to the directions of the Act of
Assembly in that case made & provided doth put place and bind unto
the said Pulliam Williamson an African named Pulliam Garner
Now of the age of 12 Months 12th day of last Sept. with the said
Pulliam Williamson to live after the manner of an apprentice
and servant until the said Apprenticeship shall attain to the age of
Twentyone years, during all which time the said African
his Master faithfully shall serve his lawful commands
every where & readily Obey he shall not at any time absent
himself from his said Masters service without leave but
but in all things as a good & faithful servant shall behave
towards his said Master and the said Pulliam Williamson
doth Covenant promise & agree to & with the said Samuel Smith that
that he will teach & instruct or cause to be taught & instructed
the said Pulliam Garner to learn to read & write also the Art and
Mystery of a planter & that he will constantly feed & provide
for said apprentice during the term aforesaid sufficient diet washing
Clothing and Apparel fitting for an apprentice & also all other things
necessary both in sickness & in health.
