In the Name of God Amen I Paul Harrelson of the County
of Person & State of North Carolina being in perfect health & of a
sound mind and memory but being very ancient and knowing that it is
Appointed for all men Once in his life time to make and Ordain this my
last Will & Testament.

Item. I leave unto my beloved wife Nancy Harrelson the House
and Plantation whereon I now live together with all the Negro
I now possess. Namely Lucy, Bush, Hilly, Lark and also
all the black children & grandchildren of the plantation
to live during her Natural life. —

Item. I will that all the property which I have delivered to my several
children at their Marriage & otherwise & which they have now
in Possession be vested in them their Heirs & Assignees forever

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son James Harrelson, James,
Paul, Jonathan, David & Abner. By head of Line & share
I now have leaving the house for James to consist Chamber
Pitcher Harrelson the Roger & others, I bequeath a
certain sum of money & twenty five acres to be equally
Divided between them according to Quantity & Quality to them
their Heirs & Assignees forever. —

Item. I give & bequeath unto my son James his 4 grandsons
Namely Lucy Ann Houston, Anna Bennett, Lucy
Nestley & Anna Weather and Anna Rainey the
my female Negroes remaining at my Wifes death
together with all my stock of cattle (except the horses)
to be equally Divided between them by my executors
named to them her Heirs & Assignees forever. —

Item. Whereas I have given unto my son Abner a Negro boy named Dick it is my Will & desire that he pay unto my five sons Henderson, James, Paul, Jonathan & David the Value of their Negroes at my death out of the Lands in which I now, by my will, and in which he will have the same, shall payable also on a division to take place after my Wifes Death provided he lives but should he die he is to share equal with his five brothers in the lands.

Item. Give and bequeath unto my three sons, James, Major, & Vincent Henderson and also my son in law William Rainey the sum of Twenty Shillings Currenty to be delivered to them at my Wifes death to them their Heirs & legatees. Item It is my Will and desire that all the remainder of my Estates consisting of the Plantation & its Household & Kitchen, furniture and every other kind whatever be equally divided between my six sons, four Daughters and Grandson namely John Henderson, Henderson Henderson, James Henderson, Paul Henderson, Jonathan Henderson, Davis Henderson, Abner Henderson, George Barnett, Fannie Parker, Maria Walker, & Homer Rainey to them their Heirs & legatees. It is my Will & I do order that my just debts be paid by all my legatees in equal proportion except my three sons & son in law Henderson, James Henderson, Major Henderson, Vincent Henderson & William Rainey.

I do by & nominate & constitute & appoint my son Henderson Henderson & other Henderson my whole & sole Exec. to carry this my last Will & Testament into Execution hereby revoking & Disallowing all other and former Wills by me made & styling & denominating this & neither toke my last Will & Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this ninth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight Hundred & three signed sealed, published, pronounced &
