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In the Name of God Amen. I, Isaac M. Murry, of the County of Person & State of South Carolina, being at the time of writing this my Mind and Memory, and Calling to mind my Mortality and that it is appointed for all men to die, I therefore, I thank God to Bless me with some worldly Property, which I do Dispose of in the following Manner, (first of all I Give and bequeath my Soul unto the Almighty God & my Body to the Dust to be decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors, Nothing Doubting But what I shall receive the same Again at the Resurrection. — Then I Give and bequeath to my well beloved Wife Elizabeth M. Murry the third Part of the tract of Land whereon I live during her Lifetime. Also the third Part of my Mills when finished during her Natural Lifetime. — Then I Also Give and bequeath to my son James M. Murry, one Negro Boy which he has now in Possession. — Then I Also Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Wife of John Sarratt, one Negro Boy called Abe, also one Negro Girl by the name of Rachel, and her increase the Boy is now in Possession of the said John Sarratt Rachel is to remain in the hands of my Wife until she please. — Then I Give and bequeath to my son Charles M. Murry one Negro girl called Venus which he is now in Possession of also one hundred Dollars to be paid two years after my Decease. — Then I Also Give and bequeath to my Son John M. Murry one Negro Boy called George which he is now in Possession of. — Then I Give and bequeath to my son William M. Murry one Negro Boy called Isaac which he is now in Possession of also I allow him the said one third Part of my Land and Mills, him Joining & finishing the Mills & paying his Part of all my Just Debts, with my Son Samuel M. Murry. — Then I Give and bequeath to my son Samuel M. Murry one Negro Boy called Solomon also the other third Part of my Land and Mills (whereon I live) which I do to him with I allow them to enjoy after my Death him helping with William M. Murry to pay all my Just Debts — & helping to finish the Mills — also one horse worth one hundred Dollars, two Milch Cows, & feather Bed and furniture. — I Also allow my two Negroes Carolina & Wm. to be maintained by Wm. M. Murry & Samuel M. Murry that they may not become a Charge to the County — also my Wife this I allow her Death I allow to be Divided between my sons William and Samuel M. Murry. — Then I also allow these Negroes to Still Jude young Carolina & Daniel & the other Part of my Property in the hands of my Widow during her Natural Lifetime then to be Equally Divided between my Children. — Then I Give & bequeath Thomas Wilson my wife's Brother a Certain tract of Land Joining the Land of Fred. Kelly, John M. Murry & others containing Two Hundred Acres — which I allow my Executors to make a Deed to him the said Wilson his heirs or assigns & the same called for —

I Also Herby Revoke all other wills heretofore made by me. They are null and void at the same time Ratifying this to be my last will & Testament.

I Do Also Appoint my Well beloved Sons James M. Murry & John M. Murry & William M. Murry, Executors. to this my Last will & Testament.

I Also allow my Children Grain to be Grounded toll free & what Sawing they want to be done free — During their Residence near them for their own use. — In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my Seal this 9th day of January 1802
