March Term 1801

In the name of God amen. I William Chambers of Person County and state of North Carolina being in a low state of health in body at present but of sound mind and memory thanks be given unto almighty God for the same, am calling to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament principally and first of all. I give and Recommend my soul unto almighty God that gave it & my Body I Recommend to the earth to be buried in Quiet Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again By the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to Bless me with in this life, I give demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form. First of all it my Will that all those just debts which I owe should be and truly contented and paid out of my personal Estate within convenient time after my decease by my Executors. Item I leave to my dear & beloved wife Elizabeth Chambers the plantation whereon I now live with all my working tools together with one Negro woman named Aggy one Negro man named Dick one Negro girl named Silvan one Negro boy named John. I leave with all my stock of every kind except what I at all hereafter mention as also one feather bed and furniture to be held during his natural life and at her death to be disposed of as follows. To wit I give unto my dear Daughter Jane Rogers the sum of Ten Shillings Current money of Ireland. Item I give unto my daughter

Elizabeth Barnatt ten shillings currency aforesaid
 Then I give unto my daughter Lucy McFarland ten shillings
 currency aforesaid. Then I give unto my grand son William
 Chambers Bull fifteen Pounds currency of S. Carolina,
 Then I give unto my son James Chambers ten shillings
 currency aforesaid. Then I give unto my son Ysias Chambers
 ten shillings currency aforesaid. Then I give unto my
 seven sons & my daughter Ann Peterson whose names are
 as follows, To wit John Chambers William Chambers, M^r
 Chambers, Elijah Peterson Chambers Henry Tison Chambers
 Davison Chambers Benjamin Chambers & Ann Peterson
 all my Estate both Real and Personal except all
 Lands and the plantation whereon I now live, and after
 the death of my wife it is my will that it should
 be Equally divided between my Two youngest sons
 Davison & Benjamin Chambers Except such part
 as hath here before been mentioned to be Equally
 divided amongst them after the Decease of my wife
 Elizabeth Chambers, and I do likewise constitute
 make and ordain my beloved wife Elizabeth Chambers
 & Benjamin Chambers my son the sole & legal Executors
 of this my last will and testament & I do hereby
 utterly disavow Revokes & Disannul all and every the
 former testaments wills Legacies Bequests and Grants
 by me in any before named with's bequeathed Ratify
 ing & confirming this and no other to be my last will
 and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal this Tenth day March one
 thousand seven hundred and Ninety eight

This indenture made the 3^d day of March in
 the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one
 between Thomas Neely Chairman of the County Court
 of Person County and state aforesaid, on behalf of the
 Justices of the said County and their successors of the
 one part and Lottin Walton of the other part Witnesseth
 that the said Th^o Neely in pursuance to an order of
 said County Court made the 3^d day of March and
 according to the directions of the said of County Court
 that case made and provided with part, place the said
 unto the said Lottin Walton an orphan named
 Joseph McDowell now of the age of thirteen years with
 the said Lottin Walton to live after the manner of
 an apprentice and servant until the said apprentice
 shall attain to the age of twenty one years; during
 all which time the said apprentice his master faithfully
 shall serve his lawful commands every where ready
 Obedy; he shall not at any time absent himself
 from his said master service without leave but in
 all things as a good and Faithful servant shall
 behave towards his said master. And the said Lottin
 Walton doth consent, promise and agree to and with
 the said Th^o Neely that he will teach and instruct
 & cause to be taught and instructed the said J^r McDowell
 well to learn him the art Mystery of Carpenter & then
 to serve for said apprentice during the term aforesaid
 sufficient diet washing lodging and apparel fitting for
 an apprentice and also all other things necessary both in
 discharge and in health. In witness whereof the parties to these
