North Carolina, Person County, May 28<sup>th</sup> 1799  
I William Gately, being of sound sense & M. mory.  
Whipped be God - But calling to mind the Certainty of  
Death & the Uncertainty of life, do make this my  
last Will & Testament in manner following (S<sup>ign</sup>) -  
Him, I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Gately  
the Tract of Land whereon I now live, one hundred  
Acres more or less, after my wife's Death, to her and  
her heirs for ever  
Him, I give & bequeath after my Wife's Death, all my  
Personal Estate of all kinds whatsoever, to be equally  
to be Divided among my Children - I do Appoint  
my two sons Joseph Gately, & Ischa Gately my  
Executors of this my last Will & Testament  
In Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Affixed  
my Seal in the Presence of  
Ischa Wamack (S<sup>ervant</sup>) William his Gately (S<sup>ervant</sup>)
