This Indenture made this 30th day of May in the year of our lord in the sixth year of our Independence, between Isaac Munden of the County of Pitt and State of North Carolina of the one part and John Harrell of the same County and aforesaid state of the other part Witnesseth that the aforesaid Isaac Munden for and in consideration of the sum of thirty pounds in hand money to me in hand paid by the said John Harrell before the ensealing and delivery of these presents the receipts I do hereby acknowledge hereof and every part and parcel hereof doth clearly acquit and discharge the said John Harrell his heirs executors and administrators and every of them by these presents have granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain sell convey and confirm unto the said John Harrell his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in Pitt County and aforesaid state on the North side of Tar River containing 56 acres is the same more or less butted and bounded as followith -- Beginning at a pine Harrel and Harris's corner thence South ten pole to a corner in the middle of the swamp thence east five hundred pole to a corner into Moses Orham [sic] line thence north said line to Harris line thence north his line to John Harrels line thence to the beginning it being part of a tract of land granted to Munden's father bearing date the first day of March 1760 as may more fully appear reference had to said grant. To Have and to hold the said lands and premises with all the appurtenances unto the same belonging to in any ways appertaining to him the said John Harrell his heirs and assigns from in and to his and their proper use and behest forever and [unclear] the said John Harrel his heirs and assigns shall and may from time to time and at all times forever hereafter by force and virtue of these presents lawfully and peaceably have hold possess occupy and any and all the above bargained premises with the appurtenances hereof free [illegible...] exonerate and discharge and from all [illegible] and all persons and former [?] grants bargains sales leases mortgages entails jointers judgments extants and encumbrances whatsoever and I commit the said Isaac Munden do for myself my heirs executors and administrators do commit and engage that the above bargained [illegible] ...to time the said John Harrell and to his heirs and assigns forever and against the lawful claims and demands of every or persons whatsoever and forever hereafter warrant and forever defend the same in manner and form aforesaid.  the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged & thereof and every part and parcel
 doth clearly acquit and discharge the said John Harrell
 his heirs Executors & assigns and every of them By these presents
 have granted Bargained & sold and by these presents doth
 grant bargain sell convey & confirm unto the said John Harrell
 his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of
 land situate lying and being in Pitt County & aforesaid State
 on the North Side of Saw River containing 30 acres to wit
 the same more or less Bounded as followeth
 Beginning at a pine Knot & corner thence
 to a corner in the middle of the Swamp & river
 East two hundred yds to a corner into the other line
 thence with a line to a corner into the other line
 to John Harrells line thence to the Beginning of being part
 of a tract of land granted to Menden's Father bearing
 date the first day of March 1760 May more fully appear
 Difference made to a Grant to Menden and his heirs the
 said lands & premises with all the appurtenances
 unto the said John Harrell to him and his assigns forever
 the said John Harrell his heirs and assigns shall & may from
 time to time & at all times forever hereafter by force and
