Spain being in sound mind do make this my last will and testament my will that after my death that I shall have decent burial and after the expenses thereof are paid: all my just debts must also be settled. The remainder is to be shared equally among my Brothers Stanley S. Spain and Sidney H. Spain and my sister Mary M. Brown with this provision that Mary M. Brown's share shall be in the hands of a Guardian that will give it to her as she needs it. If not needing shall be given to her children to have and hold forever.

In the name of God Amen. I Macon W. Tucker of the County of Pitt and State of North Carolina being of sound and disposing mind and memory and knowing the uncertainty of life and being desirous to arrange my affairs do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows

Item 1st I give and bequeath to the children of my sister Rebecca Moore and George son of my deceased brother John jointly Registrar my tract of land, all my interest in my father's estate and all my notes and accounts after payment of all just debts each and all of them to be equally interested in the said property share and share alike and it is my wish if one of the said children should die that the others should share the whole. And I hereby appoint my brother Benjamin T. Tucker Guardian for all the said children mentioned in this item to hold manage and disburse the said property or its proceeds in such way as may by him deemed best for their interest and welfare.

Item 2d I nominate and appoint my said brother B. T. Tucker my sole executor to carry out the provisions of this my last will and testament in its full intent and meaning. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal to this my last will and testament written upon one half sheet of blue cap paper and upon one side of the same this day of May AD One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one

first that my executor hereafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives & friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts, however and to whomsoever owing out of the money that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate
Item first I leave all of my estate both real and personal to my beloved wife Elizabeth Evans for the term of two years and then at the expiration of the said two years to be equally divided between her and such child or children as I may have living by her the said Elizabeth equally as the law would provide in case of no will but in the event I should die leaving no lawful issue then in that event I give in fee simple all of my estate now in hand or coming to me in any way whatsoever to my beloved wife Elizabeth Evans to have and to hold forever and lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my wife Elizabeth Evans my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same & carry a part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly voided all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made. In witness I the said Theophilus Evans do set my hand & seal in the presents of subscribing witnesses this the twenty fourth (24) day of October (1864) one thousand eight hundred and sixty four
