

Elizabeth Moore's Will.

I Elizabeth Moore of the County of Pitt and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say:

I give and bequeath to my daughter Penelope Abbotton all of my interest in the negroes that I will here to from the death of my daughter Elizabeth Moore, to wit: her share in the negroes. That I give said interest to my two grandsons Edmund Abbotton and Josiah Abbotton and if one die without a lawful heir my will is that the other should have his part. I also give to my daughter Penelope Abbotton one Bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my two grandsons Edmund Abbotton and Josiah Abbotton the negroes I have here to and have now forever and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son William Haddock from my lawful Executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made. In witness whereof at the said Elizabeth Moore's house and hand and seal at day of March 1866. Request sealed published and declared by the said Elizabeth Moore to be her last will and testament in presence of us who at her request and in her presence do subscribe our names as witnesses thereto.

I know all men by these presents that I William Haddock possessing a sound disposing mind do make and ordain this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others by me made heretofore in manner and form following to wit:

Haddock all of my stock that I now own Hogs Cattle and sheep also I give the aforesaid sum all of my household and kitchen furniture also all of my farming and Coopers Tools, also my Cows Chickens and geese also I give the aforesaid son Edw. all of the provisions that I have on hand and also my stock of Bees.

I nominate and appoint my son Edw. Haddock Sole Executor to this my last will and testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand seal this signed in presence of March the 3 1866.
