In the name of God, Amen.

I Henry Brantly of the County of Pitt & State of North Carolina having become a & volunteer in the service of the State do make and declare this my last will and testament as follows to wit.

Item. I will that my executor to sell my tooles collect my note acts and if there should not be assets enough in his hands to pay my debts that he shall sell my land lying in Naneysman Ct Va and pay all my debts expense of settling up my estate &c.

Item. If there should be funds enough to settle up my estate without selling my land I give it to my Brother John A Brantly his heirs and assigns forever. If my land has to be sold & if there should be any assets left after settling my estate I give to my said Brother J. A. Brantly all proceeds or money that is left.

Item. I give and bequeath my trunk to my Cousin Harriet W. Rawls.

Item. I appoint my friend Jas. W. May my executor to this my last will and testament in testimony whereunto I subscribe my name & seal signed sealed & delivered 27th day of May 1861 in presence of.

And the residue of my estate I give & bequeath unto Tommy James Thomas Son of Berry Thomas of Pitt County his Executors Executors & Adms. Secondly, I hereby nominate constitute and appoint my friend & relative Howell Thomas

Executor of this my last will and Testament.

This Petition coming on to be heard upon the petition and proofs it is declared by the Court that at Term 1863 of the County Court of this County a paper writing purporting to be the last will and testament of Miles Britton deceased was duly proved by the oaths of Michael Manning and Benjamin Britton the subscribing witnesses thereto and was ordered to be recorded and was duly recorded. and at the same time Anne Britton duly qualified as executrix thereto: that in January 1858 the said will the probate and record thereof was destroyed by fire with the Court House of said County and that the said will is in the words and figures following: that is to say:

"In the name of God, Amen. I Miles Britton of Pitt County being of sound and perfect mind and memory (helped be God) do this the day of in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following. that is to say. I and my wife Anne Britton my tract of land during her life and then to be equally divided between Brothers Benjamin Britton and and brother Lemuel Brittons children. and after paying all my just debts. I give unto my wife all of my negroes and the balance of my property. I do hereby make constitute and appoint my dear wife Anne Britton Executrix and my good friend Ormond Cherry Executor to this my last will and testament.

And it is hereby adjudged by the Court that the said paper writing is the last will and testament of the said Miles Britton and duly proved according to law and that Anne Britton was duly qualified as executrix thereto and it is ordered that the said will with this decree be recorded.
