 to uncertainty of human life, so make this my last Will and Testament in manner and maner  
 you following that is to say in witness whereof I have hereunto signed my name and affixed  
 my hand and seal at the residence of my Executors herein after named and also my  
 Willing Estate which the Lord in Mercy hath been pleased to bestow upon me, I give and bequeath  
 which I owe to any manner of Person or Person with my Personal Charges he paid and  
 discharge as soon as conveniently may be after my decease by my Executors herein  
 after named. Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife Anna Cornor the Dwelling  
 house I now dwell in, with all the furniture thereunto belonging together with all the  
 Land and all the cleared Land that I now hold or may clear during my lifetime  
 with timber sufficient to keep the same in good repair to be possessed and enjoyed  
 by her during her natural life. Item I give and bequeath unto my Son William  
 Cornor a part of the Tract of Land which I now live on being and being in the  
 County of Randolph beginning at a Post Oak on the West side the new Town  
 River, running South twenty chains and twenty five links, crossing the
