In the name of God Amen I Benjamin Williams of the County
 of Randolph and State of North Carolina Farmer, being weak
 in Body, but in perfect mind and memory, Thanks be given unto
 God Calling unto mind the Weakness of my body and knowing
 that it is appointed for all men One to die, do make and confirm
 this my last Will and Testament, that is to say, I hereby, and
 first of all, I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of
 Almighty God that gave it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth
 to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of
 my Executors nothing doubting but that at the General Resurrection
 I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God,
 and as touching the Worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased
 God to bless me with in this life, I give devise and assign of the
 same in the manner and form following, First I give and
 bequeath to Hannah my dear beloved Wife, the Dwelling
 House I now live in, and privilege of the Water and Wood
 for her use, and two Beds and Furniture, an Chest, and one
 pair of Drawers and one Clock, and as much household furniture
 as shall be thought sufficient for her by my Executors, Also I
 give to my Wife Forty Dollars per annum which I leave in the
 hands of my Executors for that purpose for her use during her
 widowhood and no longer, I also give and bequeath to my
 Daughter Mary and her heirs her eldest son Barnabas caught
 Two Hundred Acres of Land on the West side of Deep River.

assigning the Trushee Farmer to place a tract of Land I have given to my
 Daughter Mary Two Acres that she has had since she has married, I have
 bequeathed their Names Isaac and Ann Two Hundred Dollars to equally divide
 between them. I also give Ann Two Hundred Dollars to my Daughter Mary's Daughter
 Hannah. I also give them Two Hundred Dollars to my Daughter Mary's Daughter
 Elizabeth. My Son John has had One Hundred Dollars of his Legacy. My Son Benjamin
 has had One Hundred Dollars of his Legacy. I also give my Daughter
 Hannah Three Hundred and fifty Acres of Land lying in Greenham County
 on Deep Creek part of Three Tracts, the Paine Farm and Green Tract, I have
 One Hundred. My Son Nathan has had One Hundred Dollars of his
 Legacy. I give to my Son Henry Sixty Acres of Land on the East
 side of Deep Creek, I hereby giving to him a Quarter and the other Tract
 on Flat Creek in Randolph County being my Son John Williams, containing
 One hundred and twenty and a half Acres of Land the price of Land
 and Money that he has had One Hundred Dollars. My Son Henry's
 Wife not to come in for any part of my Estate. I also give to my Daughter
 Mary One Tract lying on the West side of Deep River known by the
 Name of Foushee Farmer Tract, containing Two Hundred and fifty
 Acres, price One Hundred Dollars. I also give to my Daughter
 Mary the Tract of Land I now live on being on the West side of
 Deep Creek, containing Two Hundred and fifty Acres more or
 less, and as much other property as shall be shown equal with the
 other Estates. If my Son Henry decease before he receives his
 Share, it is my desire that his Share be equally divided among
 the rest of my Children, and all the rest of my Property to be
 equally divided among all my Children, My Son Samuel Williams
 Children to become in One Year, and all the Money that I have
 on Interest amounting One Thousand Six Hundred Dollars
 including the Two Hundred Dollars left in my Executors hands for
 my Wife's support, during her Widowhood, to be equally
 divided among my Children, My Son Samuel Williams Children
 to receive One Share a month then. I also appoint my
 Son John Williams and Dr. Philip Langer Executors to this my
 last Will and Testament, and I do hereby utterly disavow
 revoke, and annul all and every other former Testaments
 Wills, Legacies, Requests and Executors by me in any wise
 before named, Written and bequeathed, or uttered in any manner
 this and no other to be my last Will and Testament, In Witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this last week
 of September in the Year of our Lord One Thousand
