Firstly I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary
every Ward during her natural life the sum of
whence I now live together with all that part
of a tract of land I bought of George Harmon
lying N.E. of the said leading from gray stone
to Harrisville & also such parts of a tract
I bought of William Bell adjoining to Harmon's
place on the west as I have after given to my
son-in-law Matthew Ward, son of David Ward
also two negro boys named Granville & Sam during
his life and also I leave in the care of my
said wife these negro children named Hannah
& Henry to be paid by her and used by her during
her life, also at my house hotel & other furniture
that I have given her and at my present dwelling
all which I give & bequeath unto my said
wife during her life & no longer & also
bequeath unto my said wife the sum of
twelve thousand dollars and two thousand & five
out of the parcel of land that have been
unlawfully sold at the sheriff's house because
there was at my present dwelling and
house at the place Town of Stark

In I do my dutie & sett all my Slaves free. With
With a Sufficiency of provision out of the best
or least to support herself her negro and take
her any year. As an harsher time these
Slaves Places & their Buttonge place their Country
over then have been Matthew an Culling Box
& Knives all which I give to her natural
life & no longer and I do well and since
that she above mentioned land shall not be
rented out or any of it cleared more than
it grows or the timber and more than necessary
for keeping said farm in repair
I give and bequeath unto my son Lewis Ward then
ages next Cherry, Sharpen & Arang and then
increas for and during the life of him the
said Lewis and at his death I give & bequeath
said negroes to the increas to my grandson
Benjamin Ward son of the late Lewis to him
and his heirs for ever I give & bequeath unto the
said Benjamin Ward one thousand one
thousand dollars in money to him and his heirs for
ever and if the said Benjamin Ward should die
without Lawful issue of his own then it is to
be understood that the said Slaves and money
shall descend to William Ward son of Ben-
jamin Ward son of David and Solomon
Ward son of Abner Ward to be Equally divided
amongst them Slave & Slave alike and I do
bequeath it to them accordingly —

Isaac Shelly & Sherry. Small lot next to it and at
the death of him the said David & Bequeath the

5th I give a Bequest unto my son Nathan Ward
for during his life my old plantation

then leaves viz my Bed, more and Blanket more
& my clayback Box all my stuff except what
is otherwise bequeathed to my wife and at

whole of the said lands negro and other personal
property to my grandson Solomon Ward son of the
said Abraod Ward give a Bequest to the said Solomon
Ward the part of my land where my son Abraod
now lies it being part of the Land bought by me
from Nathan Hale to be divided by a line beginning
at a Rocke Lickey on the line of Parkes Mill
Tract above my little house running thence & leaving
Hawkins road at the south corner of the field, thence
Elyot road same lies there on the lawn because to
the original line of said tract of three hundred
bounded by Harper Gray & Parkes Mill tract to
the beginning I also one thousand dollars in money all
of which I give a Bequest unto my grandson
Solomon Ward & his lawful heirs begotten by him
