 Assurance of its Resurrection from thence at the last day as
 for my burial I desire it may be decent at the Discretion
 of my Children and my Executor hereafter named who
 I Doubt not will manage it with all reasonable prudence
 As to my worldly Estate I Will and positively Order
 that all my Debts be paid & like be given to My Son my
 Daughter one horse & Cart & Wagon and to my Daughter
 Vidua one bed & table and Wicks which I formerly granted
 before and as for my other good and land I bequeath to
 each of my Son in Law an Equal share of the same
 Charles Mullin James Dickie John Gray John Ryan Lewis
 & bequeath five Shillings Sterling to my Daughter Margaret Green
 Gray my Son in Law and Ellenor my Daughter Executor
 of this my last Will and Testaments and trustees for
 my other Children in Trust Whom I have made of my
 hand and Seal this 22 Day of April in the Year of our
 Lord 1784.

The Last Will and Testaments of David Boyle

In the name of god amen the Twentieth Day of September 1786 I David Boyle
 of the County of Randolph being English and weak in body but of perfect
 mind and memory make the following god therefore taking to mind
 the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men
 once to Die Do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament
 that is to say I give and bequeath all I have and whatsoever I
 shall come into the hands of Almighty God that I give it and my body
 Resurrend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the
 Discretion of my Executor nothing doubting that at the General Resurrection
 I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of god and as
 touching such worldly Estate wherewith I have pleased god to bless me
 in this life I give Devise and Dispose of the same in the following
 manner and form -
 First my Will and Desire is that my Son Frederick Boyle is to
 have the Plantation of one hundred Acres of Land and he is to
 maintain his father and Mother during their lives and he is to have
 the third of the Estate and the parts of my Estate is to be equally divided
 amongst the five as follows. Namely Adam Boyle Crawford Thomas
 Peter Harmon or Jeremiah Whymoner Sons Heaver George Boyle Thomas
 & Cousin also to my Son Robert I give one hundred acres of Land the
 upper part of the Land he paying twenty one pounds to the Executors
 who my two grand Daughters Mary and Margret is to have and enjoy
 one Equal part with the rest of the aforesaid heirs by their fourth
 I likewise Constitute make and Ordain my Son David Boyle Executor
 of this my last Will and Testaments and my other to be my last
 Will and Testaments in Trust Whom I have made of my hand
 and Seal this day and Year above written
