Daughter on horse & plow & etc and to my Daughter
Sister one hundred pounds and guineas which I formerly granted
before and as for my other good and lands I bequeath to
each of my children an equal share of the same
Charles Mullin James Dickey John Gray John Bryan Lewis
Kas McCallum and to my grand Daughter Margaret Green
I bequeath five Pounds Sterling I Do Constitute John
Gray my Son in law and Elleroy my Daughter Executrix
of this my last will and testaments and trustees for
my other children in what place I have noted out my
land and deal this 22nd day of April in the year of our
Lord 1784.

In the name of God amen The Nineteenth Day of October in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and Sixty and three
of the County of Randolph being English and French in body but differing in
mind and memory make by Government and therefore solemnly to mind
the mortality of my body and knowing well it is appointed for all men
one to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament
that is to say principally and first of all I give and command my
soul into the hand of Almighty God that after its end my body
be committed to the Earth to be buried in Earthly Honourable at the
direction of my Executor nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as
Touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me
in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form -

Ents my Will and Desires is that my Son Frederick Boile is to
have the plantation of One hundred acres of land and he is to
maintain his father and mother during their lives and he is to have
the third of the estate and the rest of my estate is to be equally divided
amongst the heirs as follows. Namely Adam Boile Crawford, Henry
Peter & Ammon or Frederick Whayman & one thousand George Boile, Thomas
Sommer also to my Son John I give one hundred acres of land and two
super parts of the land he having twenty one hundred to the Executrix
also my two grand daughters Mary and Margaret is to have and enjoy
one equal part with the rest of the aforesaid him by themselves
to be referred and enjoyed. Benjamin Hank and Thomas Sommers
I likewise constitute make and ordain my other Executrixes of this
my last will and Testamente this and no other to be my true
will and Testamente in witness whereof I have set my hand
and Seal this day and year above written
