In the name of God Amen, I Edmund Middle born of the County of Randolph and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory do make public and solemn the following to be my last will and testament - First I give and bequeath to my daughter Lucy three negroes viz. Minny and her son Lisa and the two further heirs and provisions and two pigs -

Secondly I give and bequeath to my son John the tract of land whereon I now live lying on both sides of Poplar river reserving for the use of my beloved wife during her natural life a tract of land containing one hundred and thirty acres sufficient for her own use together with the mansion house, like the following Negroes viz. Eliah, Charles and William, together with beds and furniture and after the death of my beloved wife the said land folding table -

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy one further bed and furniture and a chest which she now claims -

Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my dear beloved wife, One Negro Girl named Chan to be known and subject to her will and disposal and further I bequeath unto my beloved wife all the residue of

of my estate and also maintenance (excepting my Mahometts tract and debt which I give unto my sons John & Edmond) My will is further that my dear wife has the use of all the residue of my estate and she shall out of the profits during her own life and maintain my daughter Nancy during my wifes life, after her death my will is that all the remainder of my estate to sell and that out of the amount of said sale five hundred dollars be paid unto my son William Edmund for the use and maintenance of my daughter Nancy and that they or either of them or herby requested to keep the said Nancy during her natural life and after her death it is my will that my son William Edmund shall continue to keep the aforesaid five hundred dollars they and their heirs forever and that the said residue of the said sale be equally divided among all my children excepting my daughter Nancy and lastly I hereby Ratify and Confirm unto my sons Thomas, William, Matthew, Edmond and unto my daughter Sallyborough Polly Martha & Lydia & Edmond all the property both real and personal which I have heretofore given to them and which they now have in their possession -

I nominate constitute and appoint my sons John, Matthew, Edmond and John the executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other and former Wills or wills by me made, and ratify and confirming this only as my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the first day of Decr in 1810

last will & testament. I do this freely declare, my wish
is to be buried therein. And all my debts paid.

1 David Williams, Jacob Williams James Williams
William Williams Daniel Williams these sons of mine
I have provided all ready.

2 I give to my daughter Abigail and bequeath that tract of
land she now lives on and at her decease it must
be divided between her three boys and they must pay
each of their sisters ten pounds and if either of them
dies should die before they come of age the lands
must go to the surviving by 4 boys.

3 I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary the sum
of \$500 Dollars.

4 I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rachel that
tract of land I bought of Wm. Byrd in Guilford County.

5 I give and bequeath unto my wife my plantation known
as one with Homer hole farm and 800 acres of land
as much thereof as will be sufficient to keep house with
and for said Charles and Lilly and two sons
and 1000 acres of land sufficient to drive the farm.

All the property that I have will & to my wife at
her death must be returned or widowhood. If she
should raise a child or other term either of them born
that I have given to my wife then I give to her her
side saddle two Oxen and Cows in sheep two
hens and pigs six hundred shate of pork.

6 I give and bequeath to Mary Williams \$500 at
decease for widowhood of my wife the sum and
Cows and sheep and pigs to be to Mary and
Williams \$500 at the decease of William Williams
wife all the rest of the property to be returned back
at her death.

7 I give and bequeath to my two grand daughters Rachel and Rebecca
for the tract of land I bought of Andrew Thompson.

8 I give and bequeath to my Grandson James the plantation known
as one after the death or widowhood of my wife.

9 I give and bequeath to my Grand daughter Martha the \$500 Dollars.

10 I give and bequeath to my Grand son John \$500 Dollars.

11 I give and bequeath to my Grand daughter Mary Williams the daughter
of James Williams & City Village. And that to be paid out
on interest till she comes to age and then to give to her.

12 I give and bequeath all the rest of my estate both real personal or
to be sold and divided among my four sons and three daughters and
then that is mentioned in the will and it to be equally divided
among them.

I do hereby instruct Isaac Lane Isaac Rogers and William Williams
son of David Williams to execute my will and testament.
