In the Name of God amen I Elizabeth Ward of the County of
 Randolph & State of North Carolina being of sound & perfect mind
 & Memory do Make this my last will & Testament in manner &
 form following - Firstly I will & direct that all real estate
 which I owe shall be paid - Secondly I give & bequeath unto
 my beloved wife Abigail Ward during her life or widowhood
 the use of my Plantation Negroes stock of every description & all
 my personal property herein not otherwise disposed of for the
 purpose of enabling her to raise and educate my children
 & do empower & upon her & my Executors herein after named to
 keep the Land properly together & not suffer it to be divided
 all which I bequeath to her during her Widowhood & to my
 child give & bequeath unto my said wife Abigail for & during
 her life the use of my Negro Man Butler, Negro Tombs, my
 young Lamb Mare her bed Chests & furniture & Live
 Hundred Dollars in Money to be paid out of said Monies
 as is due to me from my father's administration & from my
 Brother Abner Ward on account of the Difference of the
 Value of our Land. I do further Will & direct that on the
 death of my said wife that the whole
 of my personal property that is not herein particularly bequeathed
 to her or my children shall be sold & the Monies arising
 therefrom Equally divided between my children Benjamin
 Ward, Charlotte Ward, Abigail Ward, Polly Ward, Rachel
 Ward & Betsey Ward their heirs & assigns forever & do
 declare that each one share shall be kept out at Interest
 until he or she comes of age

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I Give & bequeath unto my son Benjamin Newbould at the
Expiration of his Mother's life or Widowhood the plantation Whose &
love I do direct me Executors herein after named to have the new house
which I have raised & have finished & completed as soon as convenient
I also give my land den when he comes of age the third of Decemr &
two Cows & calves which was given to him by his Grandfather Benjamin
Newbould on the Value thereof in other Cattle or Money all which I give
& bequeath to my said son he him & assigns forever

Legally I Give & bequeath unto my Daughter Charlotte Newbould my
Negro boy George at the Expiration of her Mother's Widowhood
also one bedstead & furniture all of which I bequeath to my
said Daughter he him & assigns forever

Legally I Give & bequeath unto my Daughter Abigail Newbould at
the Expiration of her Mother's Widowhood my Negro boy Matt one
bedstead & furniture to her he him & assigns forever

Legally I Give & bequeath unto my Daughter Polly at the
Expiration of her Mother's Widowhood my Negro boy Nathan
one bedstead & furniture to her he him & assigns for
ever - I Legally I Give & bequeath unto my Daughter Rachel
Newbould after the Expiration of her Mother's Widowhood my Negro
Boy Wm Perry one bedstead & furniture to her he
him & assigns forever

Legally I Give & bequeath unto my Daughter Betsey Newbould the
first Child that my Negro woman has that live & is free
one bedstead & furniture all which I Give to her he
him & assigns forever - I do further Will & direct that
in case the Money coming to me from my father's Estate
or elsewhere should not be sufficient to pay all my Debts
& the expenses of Lawyers & necessary Expenses that my

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Executors shall sell as much of such of my personal property
as my Wife shall be of the opinion can be best disposed to
answer said purpose & I do hereby constitute & appoint
my Love Friends Deft Atterville & Eliza Ann Gray Lett Executors
of this my last Will & Testament - Executors & administrators by their
present all better Will by me heretofore made & I do hereby
Publish & declare this to be my last Will & Testament in Testimony
whereof I the said Eliza Ann Gray have hereunto set my hand
