In the Name of God Amen Elizabeth دختر of the County of Danvers in the State of North Carolina being in a bad state of health, but of sound and perfect mind and memory, do this Twenty third day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Twenty one, Make and Publish this my last will and Testament in manner following, that is to say, I give & bequeath to my dear daughter Mary J. J. J. Allen the following Negroes to wit, Jann, Lenden, Lee, Jerry, Lucy, Maria, Cate, Little Snider, Miranda, Billy, Jordan, Nelson, George, and Nancy with all their increase and at her death I give the said Negroes to such child or children of my said daughter Mary as shall be living at the time of her death, and if she should die leaving no child or children at her death, I give all the above mentioned Negroes with all their increase & increase to my next of kin as shall be living at her death - all the rest of my property I give to my said daughter Mary, except such as is hereinafter disposed of. I will and direct that the sum or sums due me in Bonds and such sum as may be due from my Father's Estate together with the amount of Cash I have, shall be laid out in bank stock, to be purchased in such bank as the Trustees hereinafter appointed for that purpose shall think best: And I do give to the said Trustees the full and sole power that may be declared from time to time in the said bank stock in trust for the use of my said daughter Mary to be paid to her in such way & manner as the above said Trustees may think most to her advantage & benefit, and at the death of my said daughter Mary I give the said bank stock purchased as aforesaid to her children, but should she die leaving no child or children I give the said bank stock to my next of kin who may be living at her death. I appoint my brother John Hapley, Alexander Gray & Charles Barker & Lindsay Trustees to carry into effect this part of my will, and it is my will that my Executor hereinafter appointed, as soon as the debts owing to me are collected and a full amount of my Estate made, pay over to the said Trustees such amount of cash as may be due from him, to be held as aforesaid in bank stock by them

So soon as the same may be accomplished - and it is further my will that upon the death of one of the Trustees named as aforesaid the Survivors ones shall appoint a new to fill such vacancy - Then give to my favorite wife Harriet my Negro boy named Anne and his present years having - Then Give to my beloved Mother a pair best silver Spectacles & Case with a set of Glasses - Give to my Sister Anne ten any one silver cup - Give to my sister Sarah Elizabeth one dozen silver table spoons. It is my will that my Executor purchase the three articles named as before - at present time, which I hope they will accept - as a token of the love & esteem I have for them. I request my Brother Life Sargent to be the Executor of this my last will & Testament and I do hereby nominate and appoint him for that purpose, he to take through the said Anselm after here to this my last will & Testament set my hand & seal, the day and year before written.

I leave unto my daughter Naomi Mackie one Quarter Acre of pasture land, & two barns & my table & my best Clock & a covered blue & white small spot & three shute & one blanket and one Check Sheet & Fifty Dollars & also the prof. I leave to my daughter Catherine Cox one Quarter Acre of land & two barns, & my Dressers & cupboard & one Quarter Acre, one Flowered covered blue & white. Three shute shute, one Check Sheet & one blanket & Fifty Dollars - I leave to my daughter Hannah Cox one Quarter Acre of land & two barns, & one black, fifteen of white cloth & a blue best quilt, & three shute & one blanket, one Check Sheet & my halant Chest & my best Clock and Fifty Dollars - I leave unto my son Robert Moffatt one covered blue horse & two shute & one shute black & Fifty Dollars - I leave unto my son William Moffatt one covered blue & white skin the head & two shute & one shute black & a wolf trough & Fifty Dollars - I leave unto my Daughter Mary Walker one Quarter Acre of land & two barns, one covered & four shute, one blanket, one Check Sheet & my copper kettle one five or six Gallon pot & Fifty Dollars - I leave unto my Daughter Margaret Moffatt one Quarter Acre of land & two barns, one feather bed & bedstead bolster and

pillows one covered blue & white double damask & four shute one blanket & my box of drawers one Quarter Acre of land & one half my best Clock & bag & all my iron & cotton & a square Walnut Table & all my provisions & furniture & my table & shute & Fifty Dollars - I leave unto my son David Moffatt my shute & my best table one covered blue horse & one half my best Clock & bag & two shute one feather bed bolster & pillow one table cloth & one shute black & all my provisions blanket & all my other shute, & one hundred & fifty Dollars - And it is my will if there is any more money left it be equally divided amongst all my children, & of lacking expects daughter & that the best of my bedens & house hold furniture, wearing cloths & furniture, be equally divided amongst my daughters according to value & that my son Lewis have my Clock Case & it is my will that my daughter Margaret Moffatt be Executor & my son David Moffatt be Executor of this my last will & Testament.
