of health but of sound mind and memory do make this my last Will  
and Testament. First I give and bequeath to Anna Allard my oldest  
Child. One pair of Dishes, one Coffey, 1/2 pair to Elizabeth Duncan. Pewter  
and China Plate Glass - Thread, 1/2 pair to Sarah Elliott. One Stand of  
Dustress - Four Miles I give to William Allard. Also Job, his Brother, a  
Sister, I give and bequeath to Thomas Allard. Also Job's wife Elizabeth  
and Child Anna living on the States of Jersey brick wigmur, Barnwell  
Esq'm containing one hundred and forty one acres - Lastly, I give  
to John John Allard - Secondly, I give to Elizabeth a daughter her  
share. The balance of my Estate is to be left and an equal Division  
made between my living Brother and Sister and when any of my  
Brother or Sisters are deceased their Children to have the share with  
them unless except Anna Allard and Elizabeth daughter and if Anna  
Anna Allard deceased - Doctor the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of May 1827 - Wrote by me

named and all my just debt to be paid and after the  
remainder part of Estate in manner and form as follows that is to say  
in residue I leave and bequeath unto my Son-in-Law Elizabeth  
Moffett the Black - Barn and Clock her Bed and Bedstead  
and furniture and the privilege of the Barn and Bedstead and  
Kitchen furniture, and her maintenance on the Land during  
all her widowhood and I leave to her two Boys and Girls, five  
Lands - Sheep and Dogs. I leave her my Barn or the Bedstead  
and I leave and bequeath to my Daughter Polly Esq'r Two Dollars  
and Five Cents and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Moffett  
an old red Bell and a vial of Staggs on the execution  
as long as she lives, without she can come to go away. I leave and  
bequeath to my Daughter Anna Moffett a sufficient part of my  
Property to make her even with the Girls that are married and  
you all of the Family, I leave and bequeath to my Son  
Dolly Moffett Two Dollars, I leave and bequeath to my Son  
James Moffett and Henry Moffett all my Lands to an equal  
division between them two of they cant agree between themselves  
they must chose men to divide it between them with paying  
my Son Solomon Moffett fifty Dollars each the Money to be  
paid in twelve Months after the Execution of this Will. I leave  
and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Moffett a sufficient  
part of my Property to make her even with the Girls that are  
Married and you all of the Family, I leave and bequeath  
to my Daughter Catherine Fifty Two Dollars, I leave to my Son  
James Moffett and Henry Moffett my Waggon and Farming tools  
and herds, a present my Son James Moffett my Executor of this  
my last Will, and hereby revoking and making void all  
former Wills and bequests by me made and declaring this  
to be my last Will and Testament, in Writing hereunto set
