 I among Wintress two Shillings & 2 Pence Give
 Shop and the whole Stock of Drapery and one
 Waggon my daughter Catharine is let me as
 much property as my other daughters have got
 out of my Estate My Son Edward is to be that in
 School twelve months to come out of my Estate
 Likewise I Give to my Son John ten Shillings I also
 Give my Son Abraham ten Shillings I also Give
 my daughter Christian ten Shillings I also Give
 my daughter Ann ten Shillings I also Give
 daughter Magdalen ten Shillings I also Give
 daughter Catharine ten Shillings I also Give
 my Son Edward ten Shillings
