In the name of God Amen - I, Francis Newham of Randolph County and State of North Carolina being weak in Body, but of perfect mind and memory thanks be unto God, calling unto mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die, do make and declare this my last Will and Testament, that is to say, principally and last of all, I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that give it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a secret Christian burial at the request of my Executors; and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith I do bless God to bless me in this life, I give, devise, and bequeath the same, in the following manner and form (viz.) - First, I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Jane Newham lately born to me on the first day of May last, joining Collette Mills Estate, as is not to inheridge in my Archana no buildings, also one Iron Cellar also I give unto my Daughter Hannah. Maria Louisa & Sons of said daughter the above fifty Acres, but is not to inheridge in my Archana no buildings, also one Iron Cellar, one Cupboard, one Iron and all the Barrels and Hops, and all that belongs thereto, also one large Shovel, one Iron Spoon, Molasses, one Glass, one half dozen Butter Spoons, also I give unto my Daughter Polly Galloway one Dollar, also I give unto my Grand Son Thomas, S. Macon one Feather Bed and furniture, one Haddock, one Caddis, which he has in his possession by his paying John Davis ninety Dollars, also to my Grand Daughter Maria Macon I give one Feather Bed and furniture, one Glass, one half dozen Butter Spoons, one Glass, also I give unto my Son John Newham one Dollar, also I give unto my Daughter Jane Newham one Dollar, also I give unto my Daughter Martha Cotten one Dollar, I give and bequeath unto Jane & my Son and Daughters all and every thing that I possess in this World both real and Personal to be sold after paying my just debts, at the direction of my Executors and divided as follow viz. between William Lewis Newham, Thomas Newham, Hannah Macon, one share, giving each one to have two shares with the Boys, also I do disclaim and appoint William Newham and my Grand Son Thomas, S. Macon to be my Executors to this my last Will and Testament, ratifying
