Isaac Hobbin of the County of Randolph and State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind & memory do this 29th day of December in the year of our Lord 1807 make and publish this my last will & testament in manner following. That to wit I give to my beloved wife all the household furniture and all the other property belonging to us with the dwelling house that I now live in while she is my Widow except any lands which I give to my son Daniel Hobbin and all the property that I have given to my beloved wife if she should marry shall be lost and divided amongst my children on at her death namely Isaac John Rachel Richard Thomas Aaron Benjamin Amy Anne & Benjamin Hobbin and I reserve any more which I have given and I hereby make and ordain my beloved wife Executor of this my last will & testament in witness whereof I the said Isaac Hobbin have to this my last will & testament set my hand and seal this day near above written

In the name of God Amen George Mills of Randolph County and State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind and memory do this 15th day of April in the year of our Lord 1818 make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following. That is to say I give and bequeath unto my wife Anne Mills

and my two youngest sons Jonathan and James Mills one hundred acres of land the plantation where I now live and also one Negro girl the name of Lucy nine years from this date being then the 1st of May by the Company.

I do also give and bequeath unto my sons Aaron and Moses Mills one hundred and fifteen acres of land giving to Aaron where I now live I also give and bequeath to my wife Anne three cows I give and bequeath unto my son E. Kid Mills one hundred and fifteen acres of land where he now lives I give and bequeath unto my daughter Peter Mills one white cow I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rachel one black cow I give and bequeath to John Jackson and Williams Dippet one hundred acres of land lying in between Corners I give and bequeath to James Gaddis one roan colt I give and bequeath unto my Anne and my two youngest sons Jonathan & James three head of horse each I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Alice one bay mare. And I hereby make and ordain my worthy friends Thomas Jackson and Hanson Harris Executors of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I the said George Mills have to this my last will and testament set my hand & seal the day and year above written
