 heirs forever. He & his heirs shall pay or cause to be paid unto
 my son Christopher Nation or his heirs or assigns the sum
 of one hundred dollars but in case he should fail paying
 the said little money then Christopher or his is to have a
 right & title to one hundred acres of land south of said building
 Item I give unto my five sons (viz) John Thomas Joseph
 William and Amos Nation the sum of one shilling a piece
 Item I also give my two daughters Elizabeth & Ruth each
 the sum of one shilling a piece Item I give & bequeath
 Unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Nation all the test of my
 moveable or personal estate including my cash & bank
 During her natural life and at her death to be at her disposal
 And I also ordain & appoint my son Abraham Nation &
 my friend Christopher Vickory to be my whole & sole
 Executors of this my last will & testament in Witness
 whereof I have set my hand & seal this 11 day of November 1799

the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by

As it has pleased god to bless to me With in this life I give
Devise dispose of the same in the following Manner and fashion

In the name of God amen I Rudolph Maynard of the County of Randolph and State of North
Carolina being of sound and perfect mind & memory. Witness be God for the same. do this twenty sixth
day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and seven. do make and publish this my
last will and Testament in manner & form following. That is to say —
I bequeath to my son Jacob Frederick Maynard Adversary against Lewis Pleasant, Molly Cant-
well, Moses. Significantly LaMotte, Summers, and August Kinley each of them five
dollars during
I have Spent to my son David Maynard, one hundred and thirty five acres of land including
to plantations thereon. he now lives bounded by Smiths line and Briggs line also I give
to my son Jacob Maynard two hundred acres of land more or less on the West side of
Mines including the plantations seven lines on bounded by said track. also I give to my
son David Maynard, one hundred acres & thirty seven part of the domestic tract and thence
back to be taken of my old tract adjoining said land in the which one hundred & fifty
acres, also I give to my son Henry Maynard one hundred & fifty acres be the same more
or less on the West side of Williams, including part of the shared land. Also I give to
my son Rudolph Maynard, one hundred & fifty acres more or less adjoining Richmonds
line. also I give my will is that each of the above mentioned parts of land shall be bought
by four free holders and appraisers to the value there of each of my sons namely
James, David, Henry & Rudolph shall pay to my estate two sons, Voluntary good
wills. so much as shall make them all equal. also I give to my beloved wife
Mary on third that in made on the said land. Also I give to my said wife Mary, the
one half of the land. the choice of one horse and one set of furniture and the choice
of the house & one pasture ditch, one pasture barn & one barn plot & one doorn. as he shall
request & give pounds in money. also I leave to my wife Mary the right of my house
and property till my youngest son Solomon comes of age. then to be sold at public
auction and the money to be equally divided among my four sons namely
James, Volney, Jacob, David, Henry, Rudolph & Solomon, as my will is that
my wife Mary shall have fifty pounds of the house that seven lines on during her
natural life or less as she shall see fit. also my will is that all the rest of my movable property
shall be sold at public Auction. except one horse one cow, and all the plantation
and the land that is now on the plantation. also the house occupied by Mary
and my friend Charles Wright Esq. & Volney Maynard the money but both to be
in the which said use of the said Rudolph Maynard shall at any time & place
be my own above written
