2^d. I give & bequeath to my Son Leonard Fifty Dollars. 3^d. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Twenty Dollars. 4th. I give and bequeath to my Son Liza Fifty acres of Land wherein he lives by him during his life Fifty Dollars. 5th. I give and bequeath to my Son Jacob Fifty Dollars meaning the fifty that to be paid by Liza. 6th. I give & bequeath to my Son William fifty Cents. 7th. I give and bequeath to my Son Isaac fifty Cents. 8th. I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary Twenty Dollars Real Estate, Lot of Punter Place, Dick and Parson.

9th. I give & bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Twenty Dollars Real Estate, Lot of Punter Place, Dick and Parson. 10th. I give & bequeath to my Son Jacob Fifty Dollars & some worth Twenty five Dollars & Parcel. 11th. I give & bequeath to my Daughter Liza Twenty Dollars Real Estate, Lot of Punter Place, Dick and Parson. 12th. I give & bequeath to my Daughter Frances Twenty Dollars Real Estate, Lot of Punter Place, Dick and Parson. 13th. I give and bequeath to my Son George Fifty Dollars & a Bay Horse called Billy, Fyge & Parson, the four last named. I wish to be paid their parts in Silver that is now in hand at the death of my Widow, I wish the property equally divided between all my Children, the Stock and Wagon to be sold for the purpose of schooling the Young Children or any thing the Widow think proper to sell for the use of the family. I make and confirm my two Sons Liza and Liza Executors to this my last Will and Testament, In Witness whereof I set my hand and seal the day and Year first above Written.
