I James Whittle of the County and State aforesaid
being weak in Body but in sound mind and memory do make
and declare this my last Will and Testament in Manner and
form as follows, first that all my just debts shall be paid I do owe
and give and dispose of the Balance of my Estate as follows to wit
First, I give my loving Wife Nancy Whittle forty Acres of Land
whereon I now live including the dwelling House and all the out
Buildings with the Accretions to be laid off so as not to injure the balance
of the Plantation more than necessary, also a Negro Woman named
Daisy and Negro Boy named Dick during her Natural life time or
widowhood and also two feather Beds and furniture one Chest and
Drawers, also all the kitchen furniture with all the Dishes, Pots and
Pans of the Dwelling House the Young Slave and all with farming Tools
Sufficient for two hands, to work with in the field, also the Smaller
Tools and Waggon to the use of the family on the plantation to her the
same as to my Sons also her Choice of three head of Cows and Calves
ten head of Dogs that uses about home and her Choice of three
Ears of Flax Wheel and one Big Wheel, an ear of Cotton Goss and
one pair of Wool Goss, all the Leather or hams to the use of
the family on the plantation also a sufficient quantity of Grain
and Corn meal for her self and Stock for One Year, also all the
Stockheads and Barrels belonging to the Cedar House, also the house
known by the Name of Pompey, and also an hundred Dollars in
Cash to her, but notwithstanding of the Marriage to be cut out of the whole
I Will that the whole of the above mentioned property

not otherwise in force of be equally divided between my Two Sons John and James
Whittle but should the Remainder happen to have the value of all at his death
to have the same, so that it is within the limits of my Faculty, then I give
and bequeath to my Son William Whittle for Selling or Rent, I give and
bequeath my Lands to my Two Sons John and James Whittle share and share alike
according to quality but after the death or Marriage of my Wife Nancy my
Will is that my Son John Whittle shall have the part including the buildings
now occupied by myself with the Accretions to them their heirs and assigns forever
then, I give and bequeath to my son John Whittle One Negro Boy named
Elijah and one other named John, also also John and the above named
Daisy after the Death or Marriage of my Wife Nancy to him his heirs or
assigns for ever also One Negro Man Two Cow and Calf, two Sheep
of which he choice and one Pig, One Cow, One Heifer, one Stotck and one Sheep and
Feather Bed, One Little Girl, also One Cow and Pig - then, I give and
bequeath to my son James Whittle Three Negro Boys known by Name Peter,
Mark and Joseph, also One Negro Woman named Nancy to him and his
heirs and assigns for ever, also One Boy Horse, One Cow and Calf, Two Head of
Sheep, her Choice, One Little Girl, One Cow, One Heifer, One Stotck, One Sheep, One
Feather Bed, also One Cow and Pig - then, I give and bequeath to my four
Grand Children Children of my Daughter Nancy Brady the three daughters
fifty Quarters each, to my Grand Son James Brady I give Three Hundred Dollars
then, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Brady Wife of James
Brady Three Hundred Dollars then, I give and bequeath to my
Daughter Belinda Brady Wife of John Brady One Negro Woman
named Sally and a Negro Boy named Dick after the death or
Marriage of my Wife Nancy, also a Mulatto Girl named Mary
to her and her heirs and assigns for ever - then, I give and
bequeath to my Daughter Dorothy Gardner Wife of John Gardner
One Negro Boy named Nathan and one named Andrew to
her and her heirs and assigns for ever - then, I give and
bequeath to my Daughter Mary Sabine Wife of Emanuel Sabine
One Negro Boy named Brown, and one Negro Girl named Lucy
to her and her heirs and assigns forever - also a Black Filly of two
years old, and also after the Death of my Wife Nancy the second Marriage
then, I Will that all the balance of my Stock & Dogs go to the use of
the family on the plantation, also the Crop on hand and what is
growing also to the use of the family on the farm - then, I Will that
after the death of my Wife Nancy, my Smith Tools and Waggon and
Carts to my Son John Whittle - then, I Will that all the balance
of my Stock and all other property that is not disposed of in this Will
shall be made sale of to the highest bidder by my Executor
