Be it remembered, I James R. Reynolds of Randolph County in the State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound disposing mind & Memory bless'd & God with this twenty ninth day of the third Month in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred, do make and publish this my last will and Testament in Manner and form following, and my desire is that it may be taken by all whom it may concern as such (that is to say) first my will is that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid. Then I give and devise to my son William Reynolds sixty Acres of land including the improvement and building whereon he now lives lying and being in the County of Jones on the South side of the Creek that runs between my place and his to begin at my old original Corner standing by Samuel Chapman fence line two chains fifty six poles running thence west along my line thirty six poles near a marked corner thence north to said Creek fifty two poles thence the several Courses of said Creek as far as to make up sixty Acres of land and then to run east to my original line thence north with said line to the first station which said sixty Acres of land I give as aforesaid to him the said William Reynolds his heirs and assigns forever.

Then I give and devise to my son Chas. Reynolds beginning at a black and white Oak sapling running north on my side line to a mark 72 Poles West by South to a mark West by South 24 Poles down the Meadow fence thence North West 32 rods to a mark standing in the Creek near his spring

thence West 40 rods to my old original line thence North 72 rods to a black and white Oak sapling along my side line to the first station the quantity not known at present but all the land within said bounds I give to my son George Reynolds his heirs and assigns forever. Then I give and devise to my wife, helped, wife James R. Reynolds all the remainder of my lands, with the go on any joining on the west side of my old line with all the buildings and household furniture join on, & have the boy and the boy's wife and all the boys with the plantation look for his support and maintenance during his widowhood and at the end of her widowhood I give and devise to my son William Reynolds all my lands above mentioned for my wife with the buildings to him and his heirs I also give to my son William a negro man commonly called his and one plow and a pair of horses as, Mattie, her, my wife and wearing apparel also my Expensive tools — I give and devise to my son Chas. Reynolds twenty acres of land of the north end of the twenty acre sitting down the land which I have already mentioned for him to be laid off in a square — then I give and devise to my son Samuel Reynolds all my right and title to an entry of land now in the office at Raleigh adjoining the twenty acre survey to him and his heirs forever. It is my will that my Negro and gear be left for the use of my wife during her widowhood and then to be sold and equally divided between my three sons James Anthony and David. Then I give unto my daughter Sarah and Elizabeth each of them a bar and half and the loom. I give unto my daughter Mary Sarah Hannah Margaret Martha Margaret Ann Mark Reynolds and Christian Wilson, each of them one dollar it is my will that my monies properly yet not mentioned be sold and my daughters first paid and the remainder be equally divided between my three sons James Anthony and David all my monies properly that I bequeath to my wife during her widowhood — done

-hood, at the expiration of his term it is my will that it be sold and equally divided amongst all my sons and two daughters Sarah and Elizabeth, here and there alike. Item I give unto my son David two notes that I have upon John Reynolds my cash and bank notes I commit to the hands of my executors for the use of my widow & certain Constables and appoint my two sons David Reynolds and Ebenezer Reynolds executors to this my last will and Testament hereby revoking & annulling all other wills or legacies by me at any time made ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have at my hand and seal this day and

Item as one of the parties that I Randolph County I the will of the place above named being made being made of body but of several and differing kinds and among others he gave to John Reynolds, calling David the mortality of my body with the purpose to make and obtain the presents to contain my last will and Testament for the purpose of such words estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life in the following manner I give

Item I have the one of one third part of my plantation including the building except the stone house with fire works and timber to support the same to my eldest son Elizabeth newly during his natural life or his heirs. And I give unto my beloved wife one by name named Sam. a little child, two cows and calves he shall enjoy both his and furniture. There are during his natural life and at his death to my daughter Mary newly. Item I give my son David newly one lot and corner one cow and calf. two cows.

Item I give to my daughter Mary newly one further lot and furniture one long boat one horse three one grey horse all known by the name of John

Item I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth newly one cow and pig she may give provision of meat flour and corn.

Item I give to my daughter Mary newly two cows. Item I give to my son Samuel Elias Gabriel & Joseph newly all of my lands to be equally divided between them.

Item I give to my children the arising profits of a certain land now depending with Thomas brother of Benjamin roughly about a certain tract
