In the Name of god amen of John Barton of Randolph County being very sick and weak and  
 perfect mind and Memory thanks be to god. calling to mind the mortality of my body and  
 knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and bequeath this my last  
 Will and Testament. That in the day personally and first of all I give and recommend my  
 soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth  
 to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the Direction of my Executors Nothing  
 Doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of god  
 and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith I have pleased god to bless me in this life  
 I give demise deep of the same in the following Manner and force  
 First I give and bequeath to Catherine my Wife one black cow & calf and the big part two  
 and three quarters half a dozen geese. half a dozen Duff plates new knives and two forks. Two  
 Earthen Dishes. and my Loom and Tackling and spinning Wheel one Cows of Fleas. all the  
 and all the Corn also three Meddles of white. I give and bequeath to my Son all my land  
 all my Cloths. I desire for my Mother to keep the Cloths till he can take them that for him  
 have them and the Rate of my Estate to be sold to the highest bidder giving one year  
 and the money to be divided among my three. also constitutes my brother William  
 Barton and William McGowan to be my Executors Ratifying and confirming this and  
 no other to be my last Will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set  
 my hand and Seal this Eleventh day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand  
 Seven hundred & Ninety five
