I Jeph Wilson of Randolph County and State of North Carolina, being weak in body but of a sound mind and memory thanks be to the Lord for the same and calling to mind that is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will and testament, this 30 of the 4th month 1814 in the manner following—

First—It is my will that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of my estate. I give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth all my personal property both in doors and out except the cozened hind chain spears and long chain with a handsome maintenance of the plantation I now live on, with my four youngest Daughters till they shall come of age and while she remains my widow the house we now live in with fire wood and water.—

My land I give to my son Isaac with the wagon hind speer and long chain under the restrictions of his paying Mowson Hunt thirty five Dollars. I give to my four Daughters five shillings each, to wit: Maria,

Morden, Mary and Elizabeth, it is my will that my Executors endeavour with the help of my wisdom to secure as much of my Estate as will fit my four young Daughters to wit, Hanna, Lydia, Rachel and Sarah all upon an equal footing with my older Daughters when they shall come of age. And if after the end of my life whatsoever there be any of my movable estate remaining it is my will it should be equally divided between all my above named Daughters. I appoint Isaac Wilson and Seth Benson my executors to this my last will and testament.

In the name of God amen. I Thomas Miller Senr of the County of Randolph & State of North Carolina, being sick & weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory bless'd be God. But knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and publish this my last will and testament, this twelfth of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, in manner and form following (that is to say) principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent and christian manner at the discretion of my ex-ecutors. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give, devise & dispose of the same in the following manner and form (to wit), first - it is my will that a just and true inventory of my personal Estate shall be made by my Ex-ecutors, and also that all my Just debts shall be paid out of the moneys on hand and if not a sufficiency that they be paid out of my personal Estate as aforesaid.

Item - I leave for the use of my wife Fanny Miller all the tract of Land whereon I now live with the plantation and improvements thereon, also all my house hold furniture, plantation tools & stock consisting of horses, cattle, sheep, hogs &c. except such part thereof which may be considered necessary to be sold and which she may not have particular need of, in order to discharge my Just debts and other necessary expenses. Also I leave for the use of my beloved wife the following negro slaves (viz) Ben, Frank, Sam. Nath, Robt, Isaac, Daniel, & Anne, All the afore mentioned property both real and personal I say I leave for the use and benefit of her my beloved wife only for and during her natural life or widowhood, and then the afore mentioned
