

In the name of God Amen, I Samuel Walker son of the County of Randolph and State of North Carolina being in a very low state of health and of perfect sound mind and memory, thank be to God, calling to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, I do make and assign this my last Will and Testament that it be, peremptorily and strictly of full, I give and recommend my Soul with hands of almighty God that gave it, and my Body, I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors, and as touching such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to bless me with, I devise and assign of the same in the following manner and form to wit: First it is my Will that all my just debts be paid by my Executors, I also give and bequeath to Elizabeth Walker my wife, one half and its necessary furniture and a much money to be raised out of my personal Estate as will be sufficient to support her comfortably during her Natural life, I also give and bequeath to Mary Walker my Daughter one hundred and twenty dollars to be raised out of my personal Estate, I also give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Walker one hundred and ten dollars to be raised out of my personal Estate, I also give and bequeath to my son John Walker all my Estate that remains after the above are paid, I also appoint John Wood Parker and Joseph Walker my Executors to this my last Will and Testament, and I do by these presents devise and make void all other Wills and Testaments in writings whereof I have heretofore set my hand and Seal this twenty first day of December in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and Twenty two, Signed sealed published pronounced and declared by the said Samuel Walker as his last Will and Testament in the presence of each other have heretofore subscribed our names,
