 Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Fuller the Wife of John Fuller
 the Common life and Labour of one negro Girl Slave named
 Floss and also one Melatter Girl named Mills Inuring her
 Natural life and after her Death I do fully and absolutely
 Give the said Slave to be Sold & amongst all her Children
 the Issue of her Body the said Elizabeth Fuller or she shall
 one Slave to Divide them and if she should beget to
 Beside them for to be and equal Divisions of the aforesaid
 two Slave and all their Increase amongst all her Children
 the Issue of her body the aforesaid Elizabeth Fuller I also do
 Give her the said Elizabeth Fuller one young mare one heather
 and what other Estate I have and shall hereafter possess her with
 as appertains to her and her heirs forever according to the true intent
 and meaning of the above mentioned Deed of Gift as Witness

 person or persons whatsoever having any claim right or title whatever there
