for myself my Executors & Administrators the said Bargained Negroes
unto the said George Lucas his Executors Administrators and Assigns

being sick in body but in perfect mind & memory through Memory and
knowing that it is once appointed for all men to die this Eleventh day of the
Month of November 1790 I do make this my last will and Testament of these
worldly things it hath pleased God to bless me with in Term and manner
Following I leave my wife Anne to be Executors of this my will

I give unto my Son James Warren Esq. two thirds of the land
it being the South part of the tract whereon I now live to be sold out
to him by an Act and deed of Law & the said whole tract to be sold
enjoyed and possessed by him and his heirs forever

I give unto my youngest Son Henry Warren Esq. two thirds and
half of the land it being the remaining North part of the before mentioned
tract of land of 125 acres to be fully enjoyed and possessed by him and his
heirs forever I do also give unto my said Son Henry two hundred and
eighty in value to him I have and left in his Mother's care to be given
by her out of her Legacies

I give unto my beloved wife Anne Warren all the Furniture and
jewelry from said Estate two thirds of the value of said Estate being the whole
part of the whole tract whereon I now live and have given to my
said Son Henry to live on himself and to raise him in till he comes
age and after his decease during her widowhood I also give unto my said
wife Anne all my little Shop and Lumber Biding and household Furniture
to be fully enjoyed and possessed by her provided she pay out of said
stock and Furniture all my last & last and funeral Charges and the
Legacies I leave I owe

I give unto my eldest Daughter Rachel the sum of ten Shillings

I give unto my Daughter Margaret the sum of ten Shillings

I give unto my Son Joseph Warren the sum of ten Shillings

I give unto my Son William Warren the sum of ten Shillings

I give unto my Daughter Ann the sum of ten Shillings

I give unto my youngest Daughter Sarah ten pounds
