 Will and Testament, and desire it may be Received by
 all such: first I most humbly beseech, my soul to God
 may make beseeching his most gracious acceptance of
 it through the all sufficient merits and mediation of
 my most compassionate redeemer Jesus Christ,

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Who gave himself to be an atonement for my sins
 and is able ^{to the uttermost} to save all that come unto God by him
 living he ever liveth to make intercessions for them and
 who I trust will not reject me who desires to love
 and fear his holy name Amen. Blessed be God
 I give my body to the earth from whence it was
 taken in full assurance of its resurrection from
 thence at the last day: As to my worldly estate
 I will and positively order that all my just
 debts be paid, first I give to my dear and
 loving wife for the term of her life if she
 be the longest lover this house where in I
 now dwell with all the furniture and the land
 and tenements that be about it and after her
 death the land to be sold and equally divided among
 - amongst my three sons Frederick Sumner & John
 I will also my three daughters Cynthia, Nancy &
 Rebecca shall have a further but my furniture
 a piece I will also that my negro Sam shall the
 rest of my estate shall be sold and equally divided among
 all my children viz: John, Peter, Frederick Sumner,
 John, Cynthia, Nancy, John & Rebecca the Trustees
 Frederick Shedd and Sumner Shedd Executors of this my last
 Will and Testament and trustees for my wife and children in
 witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 20th
 day of November in the year of our Lord 1809

Jonathan Gay Will

In the name of God amen I Jonathan Gay of
Randolph County and State of North Carolina being
in very low State of health but of perfect mind
and memory thanks be given to God calling to mind
the mortality of my body & knowing that it
is appointed for all men once to die revoking
all others appoint this to be my last will and
testament that is to say principally first of
all I give and recommend my soul unto the hands
of almighty God and my body I recommend to the
earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner
direction of my executors nothing doubting
but I shall revive it again at the General

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Resurrection in the mighty power of God &
as touching such worldly estate or both pleased
God to Bles me with I give devise & dispose
of in manner following first I want all my
Just debts paid out of my property then I
give and bequeath to my son Thomas Gay
one Shot Gun. All the rest of my estate
to my well beloved wife Mary Gay as long
as she lives then after her death to be
equally divided among my children. I
appoint my wife and son Mary Gay and
William Gay Executors I whereof I have put
my hand and set my hand and seal 21 day
of Apr. 1808
