In the name of God Amen the 5th day of December in the Year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and twenty seven I John York of the County of Randolph and State of North Carolina being Weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God have called to mind the mortality of the body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in the manner and form following, that is to say principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God who give it, and my Body to the Earth to be decently buried according to the direction of my Executors hereafter named, nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and touching such and every Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and assign of the same as followeth, after my just debts is paid and funeral Expenses, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Estlin that tract of Land which I now live, containing one hundred Acres joining of Peter Hunt and to the heirs of his Body and all of the Tracts and all of the Mills belonging to the same as in and about of Land, and also all of the Tools belonging to said plantation I give and bequeath to my Grand Son Madison York, son of said tract of Land containing fifty Acres joining of Thomas Wolfe and George Grazer. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Ann (Dollar). I give and bequeath to my Son Nathaniel York one Dollar. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Eliza Ann one Dollar. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Marly one Dollar. I give and bequeath to my Son John York one Dollar. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Chamber one Dollar. And if there should be any surplus after the above legacies are paid, then that it to be equally divided amongst all of my heirs, I also constitute and name and appoint Lewis M. Master and Nathaniel York my last Executors to this my last Will and Testament, to execute

In the name of God Amen Elizabeth Fuller widow of the County of Randolph and State of North Carolina being weak and having had health of late but of sound and perfect mind and memory, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in the manner and form following (viz) I give and bequeath to my Son William Fuller fifty Acres to be paid out of my Estate by my Executors. Also I give this Will to my Son Benjamin Fuller fifty Acres. I give and bequeath to my Son Charles Fuller fifty Acres. I give and bequeath to my Son William Fuller fifty Acres. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Peggy Jordan jointly with my Grand Son George Washington Jordan a Negro Woman named Sarah of age twelve with all my other Estate consisting of Stock, Grain, Iron Tools and kitchen Furniture to be equally divided between my Daughter Peggy Jordan and my Grand Son George Washington Jordan in above named, and by them to be divided as they may think proper - and further, my Will is that all my just debts be paid out of my Estate - I also leave and ordain my above named Grand Son George Washington Jordan the sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, and hereby revoking all former Wills, in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 7th of April in the Year of our Lord 1827.
