Jonathan Gay Will

In the name of God amen I Jonathan Gay of
Randolph County and State of North Carolina being
in very low State of health but of perfect mind
and memory thanks be given to God calling to mind
the mortality of my body & knowing that it
is appointed for all men once to die revoking
all others appoint this to be my last will and
testament that is to say principally first of
all I give and recommend my soul unto the hands
of almighty God and my body I recommend to the
earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner
direction of my executors nothing doubting
but I shall revive it again at the General

August Session 1811.

Resurrection in the mighty power of God &
as touching such worldly estate or both pleased
God to Bles me with I give devise & dispose
of in manner following first I want all my
Just debts paid out of my property then I
give and bequeath to my son Thomas Gay
one Shot Gun. All the rest of my estate
to my well beloved wife Mary Gay as long
as she lives then after her death to be
equally divided among my children. I
appoint my wife and son Mary Gay and
William Gay Executors I whereof I have put
my hand and set my hand and seal 21 day
of Apr. 1808
