worldly Estate I have with it has pleased God to bless me with in this life
I do give remain and Dispose of the same in the following Manner & form.
First I do give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Jane Island, do and appoint
Institute and Ordain the Sole Possessor of this my last Will & Testament, all
and every part of my Movable Estate, with one hundred Acres of land including
the plantations whereon I have lived during her Natural life -
(Then) I do give after the death of my Wife Jane Island all and every part
of my Movable Estate to my Son Benjamin, Sally, Fanny, Mary, Abby
Cathy and Henry, to be Equally Divided (Then) I do give and bequeath
to my Son William Island, one hundred Acres of land ^{with} adjoining the land
now lives on to him and his heirs forever. (Then) I do give my Son Benjamin
Island, two hundred Acres of land, adjoining his land that he now lives on
and also I do give and bequeath to my Son Benjamin the one hundred
Acres of land whereon I now live after the death of my Wife
Jane and to his heirs forever, and I do hereby attest, declared made
and Ratified all and every Aforesaid Wills, Testaments or Executions before
said, do with and bequeath, ratifying and confirming this to be my last
Will & Testament, in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
Seal the Tenth day of December, one thousand seven hundred and thirty five

9th day in the year of our Lord 1796. I Jonathan Mullins, being dead in body
but of perfect mind and memory, thank be given to God for the same and willing to record the
last of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to Die - do make & do sign
this my last will & testament. that is to say personally and first of all. I give & bequeath
my soul into the hands of God, that gives all & for my body I do commend it to the Father
to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the discretion of my Executor nothing
binding but at the general Resurrection I shall rise in the same again by the power
of God. - and in teaching such worldly Estate I shall will it both to my wife & God
to bless me in this life. I give devise and bequeath of the same in manner & following
that is to say in the first place I give and bequeath to my dear wife below
half my share and all her increase together with all my little Hogs and household
goods and moveables I likewise constitute make and bequeath to my wife my
Eldest & sole Daughter of this my last will & testament. I likewise bequeath that
whereas my wife have full possession of all that I have for raising her children
but not to bequeath or sell my land but that it be kept safe & secure till
whereas my wife Death gives her to be legally bequeathed to my son
Thomas & my Grand son John son of Sarah my eldest daughter and I
do hereby testify & bequeath to my wife & bequeath all & every other former
testaments null and void in regard to bequeath by me in any way before
this time named & bequeathed Relying and confirming this now
be bequeathed to be my last will & testament in the last of these of these
bequeaths but my hand and seal the day & year above written -

They find due to the said Benjamin £23.9-

I Philip Bailey being of perfect mind and memory Make this my last and only Testament. First of all that is to say I give and bequeath unto my dear wife Elizabeth Bailey a black mare & saddle with two cows the heirs out of the stock to be her own sole property & the stock arising therefrom. With all the household goods and ornaments & the dwelling plantation to be under her disposal till my youngest son John Bailey is of age. after which it is my Will & Desire that my son John Bailey shall have the said plantation that I now live on lying on the North side of the Creek and branch & further it is my Will & Desire that my son John shall have one horse in the old stable & the last spring pole and abutment place. & a horse place with 200 bushels and further it is my Desire and Will that my son John shall have one horse and my wife Bailey during her natural life or widowhood and it is also my Will and Desire that my son David Bailey shall have the tract or parcel of land he now lives on lying on the South side of the Creek & branch with paying the agreed sum of one hundred & twenty five Dollars to my son Frederick Bailey & further it is my Will and Desire that my son Christian Bailey shall have the tract or parcel of land that I purchased of John Rogers & the land I retained adjoining to the said land the whole containing two hundred & fifty acres be the same man or life by paying seventy five Dollars to my son Frederick Bailey to pay twelve Dollars & a half yearly rent till paid. Further I give & bequeath to my son Christian one small horse named Black & one bay mare named Beauty & one horse place & one horse place with two pairs of my own & two trunks to be divided to him when he takes possession on his place and further I give & bequeath unto my three Daughters Margaret Catherine & Sally each of them thirty Dollars to make them an equal part with my other Daughters as they received out of my Estate to be paid out of my Estate by my Executors to be paid when they come of age it is also my Will & I do leave my house and being fifty Dollars my son David Bailey and Jacob Charles my Executors of my whole Estate to execute this my last Will & Testament agreeable to law and as is mentioned in this my Will and further it is my Will & Desire that after my last three Daughters have received the thirty Dollars each that the Remainder of my Estate of my own shall be sold and the money to be equally divided among all my Daughters below named or to be named - Barbara Weather. Sally Barnes. Elizabeth Reed. Mary Woodman. Margaret Rogers. & Frances Rogers & Sally Rogers it is also my Will and Desire that my grandson Frederick Rogers if he should continue with my son John Rogers till he is twenty one years of age that he shall good looking such as Reading & Writing & above Valued to about fifty Dollars with agreed to be divided one of the two not staying the aforesaid toward the share to be divided among the four. and I do hereby utterly disallow such & bequeath all and every other former Testaments. Wills & Legacies Rights and Executions by me in any way before this time the same to be void and bequeathed to my Executors & confirming this & no other to be my last Will & Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this Twenty fifth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & 0.
