 In the Name of God Amen. I Joseph Farmer of the State of N. Carolina
 Joseph County being very sick & weak in body but of perfect
 Memory thank be to God & Calling to mind the shortness
 of my life And knowing that I am appointed for all men
 once to die as make and Ordain this my last will &
 Testament that I to say principally and first of all
 I give & bequeath my soul into the hands of
 Almighty God that gave it to my body I commend
 to the Lord to be buried in a decent Christian Burial
 At the Direction of my Executors & as touching such
 worldly Estate where in it has pleased God to bless
 with in this life I give Devise & Dispose of the same in
 the following manner & Form.
 First I Devise and Command that the balance of my
 may be sold and three thirds and part of the fourth of some
 other things as the Executors and my wife may think
 proper. I likewise I leave to my beloved wife Mary Farmer
 one bed & furniture and some of the Pewter and one Cow &
 steer and the young mare & her saddle for & during her
 Natural life I likewise leave to my beloved son Joseph
 Farmer one bed & furniture one Cow & a Colt which he
 already claims I then give to him the big horse steers
 I give to my wife beloved son Solomon Farmer a bed
 furniture and one Cow and a Colt which he claims
 already and the next biggest part my land I leave
 for the support of my wife and two sons Joseph &
 Solomon till my son Joseph Farmer shall
 arrive at full age & according to Law and at his
 funeral to such age the land is to be sold and
 Divided between my three sons James Joseph
 & Solomon Farmer Excepting fifty Dollars which
 I desire to be allowed to my beloved wife if she
 lives & remains a widow and the remainder
 part to be equally divided between the abovesaid
 mentioned three Boys James & Joseph & Solomon
 I likewise desire that my debt may be paid
