 from thence east to the north and south line of the original
 and from the mouth of the said Spring branch of the original
 which is to the mill road lower said branch thence south
 come till it strikes the original line to be marked by
 according to the true contents of this will likewise one feather
 furniture and plow and team and horses thence to
 Also I give and bequeath to my son William Walker and his
 remainder together with the mill and Improvement thereon
 my Hogs and Hens and two hogs named Bachelor
 my Hens called Billa make and one feather bed and
 and one plow and harness it is further my will that all the
 of my estate be sold after my decease my debt satisfied and
 my Wife and my four children Ann Mary Henry Samuel
 Williams

Lastly I do make and constitute my son in law Robert Field
 James Hunter Executors of this my last will and Testament
 Dated this 24th day of April 1773.
