 to my Son William Robbins named Daniels. Item, my will
 is that if my beloved Wife Eliza Robbins die or Thomas
 that my Negroes Carpenter and put with their ~~Children~~ ^{Children} shall
 be Equally Divided among my three Sons Joseph Robbins
 and John Robbins and William Robbins. Item, I have also
 Item, my will is and I bequeath the whole Benefit of five hundred
 acres of Land lying in Randolph County on Main Road in
 two Tracts to my Daughter Anna Robbins Nancy Robbins
 Mary Robbins & Eliza Robbins. Item, I have also to be
 Equally Divided among them by my Executors as they shall think

think proper. Item, my will is and I give over all my Right ~~Land~~
 and Interest of one tract of Land on College Creek to Benjamin Curtis
 from me and my heirs to Benjamin Curtis his heirs and assigns
 forever. Item, I will and bequeath to my Daughter Rachel one lot
 to be Believed to her next full by my Executors, which is in full
 all that I will to her the said Rachel out of my Real and per-
 sonal Estate. Item, I will and bequeath to my Daughter Eliza
 now the wife of Thomas Curtis ten Shillings which in full of her
 the said Eliza share of what I have her out of my Real and
 personal Estate. Item, I will and bequeath to my Son Joseph
 Robbins ten Shillings over and above what I have given before
 which is in full for his share of my Estate Real and personal.
 Item, my will is that two hundred & forty Acres of Land lying
 on the Trading Road be sold by my Executors to pay my
 Just Debt as soon as my Executors shall think proper.
 Item, I constitute and appoint my beloved Wife
 Eliza Robbins and my Son Joseph Robbins my Executors
 of both my Real and personal Estate and make this
