of Jesus Christ he hath pardoned all my sins, and
that my body be decently buried at the discretion of
my Executors hereafter named. And I do name that
all my just debts and funeral Expenses within con.

venient time after my decease be paid and satisfied
 And as for such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God
 to bestow on me with Pardon thereof in manner & form
 following Viz. Item I do give bequeath unto my beloved
 wife Judith Worth all my personal together with one
 third of the real income of my Real Estate during her
 natural life. After my wife's decease, Item I do give
 and bequeath unto my son Charles Worth a Cow that
 is now in his possession. Item I do give & bequeath
 unto my son George Worth one bed & furniture to
 go with my wearing clothes. Item I do give unto
 my son Paul Worth one bed & furniture. And I give
 and assign unto my son Paul Worth my household and
 land together with all my cattle horses and all my
 stock of every kind and all my farming utensils to
 have his heirs and assigns forever. Item I give
 unto my two sons Julius Worth and George Worth three
 fourths of my Meade property to be equally divided
 between them. Item I do give bequeath unto my two
 daughters Fannie Milner and Melinda Tolson the remain-
 ing part of my Meade property two thirds to Melinda
 and the other third to Fannie. And Lastly I do
 constitute and appoint my son Paul Worth and my
 Kinsman Job Worth my Executors with power to
 carry into execution this my last will & testament
 In witness whereof I the said Joseph Worth have
 hereunto set my hand & seal this thirty sixth Day of
 the Ninth Month Anno Dom. 1811
