I Martha Hornbrough of the State of North Carolina and Randolph County being of sound mind and memory calling to mind the certainty of death and the uncertainty of life do this fourteenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen make this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say —

first — After all my just debts and funeral charges be settled I give and bequeath to my beloved Rose Barbara Foster one cambric gown and one silk handkerchief to Barbara Foster being in Guilford County and State aforesaid

Secondly — I give and bequeath to Thomas Hornbrough Esq; of Randolph County all the remainder of my Estate of all and every description whatever to receive and hold forever after my decease —

And I appoint and ordain my worthy friend Thomas Hornbrough Esq; of Randolph County and State aforesaid my executor to this my last will and testament
