think proper to make and ordain these presents to
contain my last will & testament in the following
manner I form & sign First my will is that all my debts

one Coffy Mill one Note for thirty two dollars fifty two
cents in Henry Pearson two pewter Basins three pewter

Item I give to my daughter Rachel Lee one feather bed and
furniture curtains &c one large pot one Note on Pearson
& Hill for forty dollars one Cash & W. L. that I have sold
them for thirteen dollars also one large basin & dish and one
pewter plate - one stock Box -

Item I give to my son Isaac this will be paid I have said
eight the large pot, one Can & bottles I give to him

Item I give to my son Nathan Hill one Brown Kipper &
Eight dollars that I have sold for

Item I give to my son Robert Hill Eight dollars to be paid
out of my Estate

Item I give to my two daughters Margaret Bandy and Rachel
Lee after the legacies the balance of my property

Item I likewise nominate constituted and appoint my two
sons Sam^l and Aaron Hill Executors to this my last
will & testament and I hereby wishing & recommending

Executors

shall have the sorrel Mare & she to be Valued all things
to be Valued that my first Children have and receive

Whereas I Matthew Coburn of the County of
Randolph State of North Carolina calling to mind the
uncertainty of time here do think proper this twentieth
day of the third month in the year one thousand eight
hundred & fourteen to make the following distribution
of such property I am possessed of and first I desire
that all my Just debts be paid: and secondly be
2^d I give to my son George my desk & writing paper
and to his wife a good suit
3^d I give to my son William fifteen acres of land beginning
at a post his own corner running S 60° E to a hickory
then S 60° W 1 1/2 Chs to an Iron wood at Ropes Creek
then up side creek 3 1/2 Chs of Chs Cropping an acre then
N 1/2 Chs to a P.O. then N 1/2 Chs to his place
I give to his brother Samuel But in case
he should fail in paying his brother ten dollars
I shall make the sum of \$10 in the same amount fifteen acres of land
